

Health & Safety

<u>Staying safe in the kitchen:</u> The kitchen is a fun place to make delicious meals and snacks, but it's also where accidents can happen if we're not careful. Here are some easy kitchen safety tips to keep you safe while cooking:

- 1. Always Ask an Adult for Help: Some kitchen tasks can be dangerous, like using sharp knives or handling hot appliances. Always ask an adult to supervise you when you're cooking or baking to stay safe!
- 2. Wash Your Hands: Before cooking and after handling raw ingredients, wash your hands with soap and water to avoid spreading germs. This helps keep you and everyone else safe from foodborne illnesses.
- 3. Handle Knives Carefully: Always cut away from your body, use a cutting board, and make sure knives are sharp (blunt knives are more likely to slip). Never leave knives in the sink where someone might reach in and get cut.
- 4. Be Careful with Hot Surfaces: Ovens, stoves, and even microwaves can burn you! Always use oven mitts to handle hot pans, and never leave hot pots unattended.
- 5. Keep the Floor Clean: Spills happen, but they can lead to slips! Clean up any spills right away and keep your workspace tidy.

4-H Scholarships

All 4-H members who are currently in grades 10-12 are eligible to apply for Indiana 4-H Scholarships sponsored by the Indiana 4-H Foundation. Ripley County 4-H members who apply for the state Senior Year Scholarship or Accomplishment Scholarship will automatically be submitted for the six county scholarships also. Information about Scholarships can be found on the State 4-H Scholarship Web Page or by contacting the Extension Office.

Scholarships are due January 25, 2026!



Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

Eligibility: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

Awards: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier

FOREST MANAGEMENT FOR THE PRIVATE WOODLAND OWNER

Workshop Information

Forests cover nearly 20% of Indiana, and approximately 85% is in private ownerships like farms and families. Less than 20% of those owners have a forest management plan to guide them in the sustainable management of their property. Forests provide multiple ecologic, economic, and societal benefits, but may not be realizing their potential due to poor or no management activity, and threats like invasive plant species and pests. Indiana forests also support an important forest products industry, employing thousands of people and supporting many rural communities. Private forestland owners are often unaware of the resources and assistance available to them for realizing their property management goals. Forest Management for the Private Woodland Owner provides 8 evening indoor sessions and 1 field tour providing information on the biology and management of Indiana woodlands.
