Why?

Being out in the heat can be very hard on our bodies. If we don't take care of ourselves it can lead to heat exhaustion or even a heat stroke.

When?


During the hot summer months it's important to pay attention to the temperatures and heat conditions. The National Weather Service will issue advisory's, watches, and warnings when excessive heat is expected. In general, the National Weather Service will issue these if the heat index is expected to be over 100 degrees.

How?

Stay safe during excessive heat by taking these precautions:

- Stay out of the direct sun when possible. If you must be in the sunlight, be sure to wear sunscreen to protect yourself from sunburn.
- Stay hydrated by drinking water often. It's suggested that you drink one half of your body weight in ounces of water.
- Take breaks often to stay cool and hydrated.

FairEntry Information

It's the time of year where we now ask 4-H members to complete FairEntry. Fairentry is the system we use to enter what projects you are bringing to the fair, make show bills, create judges packets, input results, and so much more.

Fair Entry

It is highly important that you complete FairEntry by **July 8th** to be fully eligible to compete at the fair. According to the Indiana State 4-H Policies and Procedures Section 4.6 Exhibition Deadlines, 4-H members who make no attempt to complete FairEntry, the following rules apply: For livestock projects: "Those missing this deadline may exhibit and will have opportunities to receive feedback from the judge. Youth may still participate fully in showmanship classes." For non-livestock projects: "Those missing the deadline may compete and the highest placing is

If additions or corrections are needed after the 4-H member has attempted to complete FairEntry, these will be made without affecting the 4-H members participation. Please let the Extension Office know of any changes as soon as possible.

Helpful Tips:

- We suggest using Fire Fox or Chrome to complete FairEntry. Internet Explorer doesn't work well with FairEntry.
- Remember you will use your 4-H Online Login Email and Password to access FairEntry.
- You must be enrolled in a project in 4-H Online before you can add an Exhibit for the project in FairEntry. If you need a project added into 4-H Online please contact the office.
- Double check that all exhibitors have all their entries created before submitting! Once you click "Submit," you will not be able to make any changes online. You will not be able to add another exhibitor or any more entries until the first submission is processed. Each submission is reviewed by a staff member and either approved or sent back.
- If you have questions or need to make a change please just give us a call, we are open Monday Friday 8AM-4PM except for Holidays.

Attached at the end of the Newsletter is a "Step by Step Guide for Entering Exhibits in FairEntry System." This guide should help with 4-Hers registering all projects.



There is often times confusion between 4-HOnline and FairEntry. Please use the infographic to the right and the FAQ section below to help. if you have further questions don't hesitate to give us a call at 812-689-6511

Frequently Asked Questions:

"Who all must complete FairEntry"

All 4-H members who are exhibiting a project or animals at the fair must complete FairEntry. Mini 4-H members are not required to complete FairEntry but are highly encouraged to as it is good practice for the future.

"What all should I enter into FairEntry?"

You should have 1 entry per exhibit hall project and 1 entry per animal that you plan to show at the fair. Don't forget to include entries for event type projects such as pocket pet, communications, and fashion revue.

"When do I complete FairEntry?"

FairEntry is open until <u>July 8, 2024</u>. If you have corrections after this date please contact the office ASAP.

"Where do I go to complete FairEntry?"

In a web browser, preferably Chrome or FireFox, search:

"Why do I have to do FairEntry?"

FairEntry is the System we use to let us know exactly what you're bringing to the fair. It also allows us to input results during the fair and share that information with the public.

"Didn't I already do that?"

Benefits of Family Dinner:





Conversation at the dinner table is even better than reading to children in boosting their vocabulary, and helping them to read.

Kids who start eating dinners now are less likely to be overweight later.

New parents who develop a dinnertime ritual feel more satisfied with marriages.





Strong link between family dinners and academic performance, even stronger than doing homework, sports, or art.

Increased intake of fruits, vegetables and micronutrients, and fewer fried foods, trans fats and sodas.

Children feel more connected to siblings and parents.

Teens who eat regular family dinners are more likely to get A's in school.

Reduces high risk teenage behaviors like smoking substance abuse, eating disorders, teenage pregnancy and violence.

Opportunity to check in with kids to find out how they're doing.










- 17. Select the dot next to the 4-H Club that you belong to and then select the green "Continue" box. Next, enter in a description of your exhibit and click Continue—please be specific as this description for non-animal exhibits will be used to distinguish between exhibits, example—don't just type in "photo", type in more description, such as "Butterfly on leaf photo"
- 18. Answer any Additional Questions required for that entry.
- **Once you are done with the uploads, then click the green "Continue" box.
- 19. When each class entry is complete, you have 4 choices for what to do next:
 - a. If this exhibitor has more class entries to make, you can Add another Entry
 - If all class entries have been completed for one exhibitor, you can Register another Exhibitor in this family.
 - If all entries for all exhibitors in the family have been completed, Continue to Payment to finalize and submit your entries.
- **The payment section is a formality of the system. No payment is needed, but you must go through the steps to submit your entries.






SECTION 3 - Animal Entries

 The first two steps of selecting a department and division are similar. Once those elections are made, the exhibitor will be asked to first select a class.




- To register an animal entry from 4-H Online, you will select the white "add an animal" box during the entry process.
- 21. A list of those animals that you have previously ID'd in 4-H Online that are eligible for that class are listed. Select the circle next to the animal you would like to enter. Then select the green "Select Animal" box.
- **To enter a Cat, Dog, Rabbit, or Poultry, please select "Enter a New Animal Record", and complete all applicable fields on the screen.





- 22. All of the information about that animal will be pulled over from 4-H Online, so that you can check to make sure that is the correct animal. If you want to switch to a different animal, click on the "remove from entry" box. If it is correct, click the green "Continue" box.
- 23. This then takes you to answer any Additional Questions required for that entry (similar to Step 18).



SECTION 4 - PAYMENT TAB

***The payment section is a formality of the system. No payment is needed, but you must go through the steps to submit your entries. It is best to enter all entries for all exhibitors in your family before completing the Payment and submission steps.

- 26. Review your invoice, in either summary format or detail format. If it looks correct, click the green "Continue" box. If not, go back to the entries tab and fix what you need to.
- 27. Select the green "Continue box.
- 28. Continue to confirm and submit your entries. NOTE: Once you hit submit, you cannot edit your entries.
- 29. Click the Submit button to submit your entries.
- 30. You will receive a "Thanks!" message. You can choose the button to "Visit Dashboard" to see your entry.

You will receive an email from FairEntry after your entry has been submitted.

You will also receive an email from FairEntry letting you know if your entry was approved or rejected by the County Extension Staff. If part of your entry was rejected, a reason will be listed and you will be able to log in and fix the problem before submitting that entry again.
