Fire Prevention

October 6-12 is fire prevention week. Fire Prevention should be practiced year-round but now is a great time to make sure you're taking steps to prevent a fire and that you and your family are ready in case of a fire.

Here are a few tips to help with fire prevention and preparedness.

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (like a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of the home.
- Make sure smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or don't respond when tested.
- Have a plan in case of fire, know where to meet, your home address, and who to call in case of an emergency.







Simply put, early detection saves lives. When caught in its earliest, localized stages, the 5-year relative survival rate for breast cancer is 99%. But what is early detection? Early detection means finding breast cancer at an early stage, before it has a chance to spread and is easier to treat. The Susan G Komen Foundation suggests that you talk with a doctor about which screening tests are right for you if you're at higher risk. Have a mammogram every year starting at age 40 if you're at average risk. Have a clinical breast exam at least every 3 years starting at age 25, and every year starting at age 40.
