



## Registering as a Judge in 4-H Online

If you registered as a judge last year and are re-registering this year, login to 4-H Online using the family credentials, click “Enroll Now” under the “Other” program next to your name, then skip to page 6, “4-H Judge Enrollment”

If you are registering as a judge for the first time and your family has an existing 4-H Online account but need to add a new family member, login to 4-H Online using the family credentials then skip to page 4, adding a new profile to the family.

If you are registering as a judge for the first time and you are a current or past 4-H volunteer with an existing 4-H Online account and profile, login to 4-H Online using the family credentials and skip to page 5, creating a judges profile from an existing volunteer account.

Anyone new to the 4-H Online system begin on page 2.

Users receiving an error message or needing assistance should email [in4h@purdue.edu](mailto:in4h@purdue.edu) providing tech support the exact error message received or specific information about the issue being experienced.


## Creating a New 4-H Online Account

If you already have an account in 4-H Online, you can login to your account and proceed to "4-H Judge Enrollment".


1. Go to <http://v2.4honline.com>.
2. Click "Don't have an account?" if you have never enrolled in 4-H before using 4-H Online.



3. Select Indiana from the drop-down menu.



4. Choose "State Office" as your county from the drop-down menu.



5. Complete your family's information.

Indiana 4-H Exhibit Judging Consent

Thank you for your interest in becoming an Indiana 4-H judge! Judging is an important part of the educational process and provides an opportunity for young people involved in the 4-H Program to receive honest feedback from an unbiased qualified adult knowledgeable in that subject matter. Some exhibits are evaluated by judges in an open or conference style format and provides the judge an opportunity to discuss the exhibit with the 4-H exhibitor. Other times judging occurs in a closed-judging format and judges communicate information to the 4-H exhibitor using a score card evaluation.

County and state fair 4-H exhibits are designed to allow young people involved in the 4-H Program to create a display demonstrating skills learned by participating in a variety of experiences throughout the year about a certain project or subject matter. As a judge, you will review 4-H exhibits within a particular project or subject matter and provide constructive feedback to the young person. Judges also assign a ribbon placing and select award winners. Be sure to visit <https://bit.ly/indiana4hjudging> to learn more about Indiana 4-H exhibit judging and review several resources for 4-H judges.

- This form is not a contract, but if hired to be a judge, you will enter into a contractual obligation and will be expected to adhere to the specific guidelines provided by that fair entity.
- You will conduct yourself in a manner that is reflective of the Indiana 4-H Program and will adhere to any guidelines/policies established by Purdue Extension. Failure to do so could be cause for not being considered as a judge in future years. Judges are role models for youth.
