

This workshop will fulfill Scott County members educational requirements to sell in the auction.





Club Officers and job duties...most clubs will elect officers at their January meeting so be thinking about if you'd like to run for an office in your club meeting!



4-H OFFICERS' DUTIES

PRESIDENT (1)

- Serve as the spokesperson for the group.
- 2. Prepare business agenda and conduct meetings using appropriate parliamentary procedure.
 - (Contact members and coordinate reports from club members.)
- 3. Keep the 4-H Leader informed of club activities and business. Contact the 4-H Leader one week in advance of meeting to set agenda.

VICE-PRESIDENT (1-2)

- Chairman of all committees. Make sure committees are ready to function and report at meetings.
- 2. Perform President's functions in absence of President.

SECRETARY (1)

- 1. Keep accurate minutes of all meetings.
- 2. Report minutes of previous meetings at the current meeting.
- 3. Initiate phone committee to inform members of upcoming events.
- 4. Correspond with individuals who conduct programs or help group with activities.

TREASURER (1)

- 1. Keep checkbook balanced.
- 2. Assist officers in preparing financial statements and budget.
- 3. Report monthly transactions and balances of checking and savings accounts at each club meeting.
- Co-chair fund-raising activities.

REPORTER (1-2)

- 1. Report group's activities in local newspapers.
- 2. Keep record of all media efforts to promote group.







Who has a pet cat?! Did you know that 4-H has a CAT project? You show your inside or outside cat or kitten. Cats are judged according to condition of eyes, ears, coat, nails and body-build. Proper handling will also be considered. Cats come to the show in carriers and get out when being judged. The show is at the Saddle Club Building during the fair. This year it is set for Monday, June 23rd at 3 pm in the saddle club building.

Cat and kittens will have to have a signed vaccination form from their vet that will be turned in at the show.

You have until May 15th to add the cat project to your list of projects! See you at the fair.

2024 Volunteer Enrollment- A Three Step Process



Starting this year, New 4-H volunteers will go to 4honline.com and fill out a new volunteer application through the website. Once you have completed the application, the Extension Office will check your references and complete your background checks. When those are done, the 4-H Youth Educator will contact you to explain the final step of the process.
