WAR	TS	Occurs when the calf's resistance is low because of stress, allowing bacteria or viruses to start an infection.				
BVD		Causes swelling and lameness. Skin between the toes and around the foot turns red, and the foot will have a foul odor.				
CALF	SCOURS	Occurs when there is a low level of magnesium in the blood- stream of the cow, usually when cattle are turned onto a fresh pasture and are nursing a calf.				
FOO <sup>-</sup>	T ROT	Is a contagious virus that causes diarrhea, abortions, weak calves, high temperature, discharge from nose, and problems in the intestine.				
GRA	SS TETANY	Caused by an infectious virus. Serious cases are unsightly and painful.
