




# **Tractor Updates**



### INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE

To exhibit BEEF CATTLE, DAIRY CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, MEAT GOATS, DAIRY GOATS, PYGMY GOATS, POULTRY, and RABBITS,

4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training **OR** the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA) by July 1, 2025.

- 1. This certification must be done an annual basis
- 2. Members must be registered BEFORE attending a training
- 3. Members may attend any training dates listed on this flyer
  - OR a training in another county
    - OR complete the online YQCA training
