

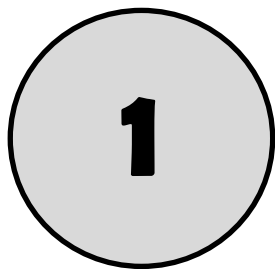

What is 4-H? 4-H is an educational positive youth development program. Indiana 4-H is part of Purdue Extension. The Vanderburgh County Purdue Extension Office manages Vanderburgh County 4-H programming.



Who can be in 4-H? 4-H is for youth in grades 3-12. Vanderburgh County also has a Mini 4-H program for children in kindergarten through 2nd grade.

When Can I join? The target enrollment window is October 1 - January 15. We encourage you to enroll during this time to attend meetings and learn about all 4-H activities!

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Trips

4-H Camp - Youth in grades 3-6 can participate in this fun-filled camp that includes crafts, sports, swimming, boating, nature, and more.

4-H Round-Up - Youth in grades 7-9 can attend this trip to Purdue University to learn more about careers, develop leadership abilities, and get a taste of the college life.

4-H Academy - youth in grades 9-12 learn about a specific subject matter through hands-on learning at Purdue University. Workshops include animal science, STEM, Food Science, Plant Science, Finance, Health Careers, Journalism, Citizenship, and Entrepreneurship.

Citizenship Washington Focus—2 youth in grades 9-12 can win a trip to Washington DC to learn about citizenship, community development, and government affairs.

State Jr. Leader Conference—Jr. Leaders can apply for this trip to develop leadership skills, learn group dynamics, and awareness of self and others.

4-H Band/Chorus - High schoolers can apply to be a member of the 4-H Band or 4-H Chorus. They attend a workshop and perform at 4-H Round-Up.

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Activities

Performing Arts - Showcase your talent by singing, dancing, playing a musical instrument, performing a skit, and more. Participate individually or as a group.

Robotics Contest— This contest is an opportunity for 4-H members to develop and refine their engineering and computer programming skills.

Career Development Events - Youth can participate in these competitive events to showcase their knowledge on a specific topic such as Crops, Milk Products, Dairy judging, Entomology, Forestry, Horse & Pony judging, Livestock judging, Livestock Skillathon, Soil judging, and/or Wildlife habitat. Participate individually or as a group.

Fashion Revue - Youth that participate in sewing and/or consumer clothing projects can showcase their garment at this contest.

Garden Contest - Youth that grow a garden can participate in this contest for small and large gardens.

Speech & Demonstration Contest - Youth can showcase and refine your public speaking skills at this contest.

Shooting Sports Contest - Youth can showcase their talents in a shooting sports discipline.

Tractor Contest— Youth can showcase their tractor and/or lawn mower driving skills at this event.
