PARKING AT THE FAIR

In previous years parking has been an issue at the Warren County 4-H Fair. So please, let's practice courtesy.

<u>DO NOT</u> park on the West side of the Swine Building. (FIRE LANE) DO NOT park in front of the Coliseum entrance/

<u>DO NOT</u> park in front of the Coliseum entrance/ building.

<u>DO NOT</u> park in <u>front of the Extension Office at any</u> <u>time.</u>

DO NOT park in the lot between the Beef/Horse/Sheep barns and the pool.

These parking spots are reserved for Judges, the Warren County Queen and Extension Staff that need to get in and out quickly. *Also, do not block entrances, roadways or places where emergency vehicles may need to have access.* (Example: roadway between the Senior Center and Food Building must be left open.) Trailers should be parked in the grass area on the north end of the fairgrounds, just west of the pavilion & playground. Please park straight and close so more trailers can be parked in less space. *Courtesy is key.* Thank you for your cooperation!



POSTER EXHIBITS & LABELS

Remember: Posters must be displayed horizontally **NOT** vertically! *Except for Photography salon prints.* All must have a plastic covering and a hard backing. See your 4-H Handbook for more information. Poster foam backing and plastic sleeves to protect your 22" X 28" posters and Salon Prints are available at the Extension Office.

Foam Backing - \$4.00 Poster Sleeves - \$1.00 Salon Sleeves - \$1.00

Sleeves are a clear, lightweight plastic that a poster or salon print slide into. Be careful with the sleeves and you may possibly reuse them later.



Please note: We will be printing Exhibit Tags for each project from FairEntry for pick up on **June 5th from 5-7pm** at the Extension Office. The Exhibit Tag size will be the same as last year. The tag size will be roughly 3" (wide) x 4" (tall). Tags should be placed in the lower right hand corner of posters **ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE SLEEVE**. We will be adding placement stickers to the tags at judging. Tags for non-poster projects should be attached with string. Please write your name on the back/bottom of your project or under where the tag will go as a back up in case a tag is lost.

MANUALS & RECORD SHEETS

How do you find out about the requirements for your project? Refer to your 4-H Handbook. Projects vary in requirements from what is stated in the manuals. Be sure that you check out what the Handbook says. It will override what is in the manual. You will need to meet the project requirements (including activities in the manuals and/or records sheets to exhibit your project and to be complete). The 2025 4-H Handbook can be found online at

You will not be considered completed in the project unless your manual and/or record sheet is filled out.

NON ANIMAL PROJECT COMPLETION

Are things not quite coming together for your project exhibit like you thought? Are you wondering if you can get your project completed? **You can still complete your project if you complete the project requirements of the manual and/or record sheet.** We know that most of you want to get your exhibit for the fair completed, but we realize that roadblocks do come up (sick animals, broken parts, missing pieces or just not coming together like you hoped). To complete your project you will want to turn in your project record sheet and/or manual with activities completed, when the project is due.

* LIVESTOCK must do a poster or interactive demo to complete if an animal is not being shown.

EXHIBIT INFO

After your project has been judged, it will remain on display either at the Senior Center or the Coliseum for the duration of the fair. You may see your project on display between 10 am and 7 pm, starting on Tuesday, June 17.

PROJECT PICK-UP

All static projects, ribbons and judging feedback will be released between **3-4 pm on Saturday**, June 21st from the Senior Center.

<u>This is your responsibility</u>. Please make arrangements with a friend to remove your projects from the fairgrounds if you are unable to do so yourself.

HAND WASHING

Hand Washing is one of the most important ways to prevent the spread of germs. When washing hands, it is

important to scrub for a full 20 seconds. Many forget to wash their hands for this long. Teaching children in a child care setting to sing a "hand washing song" while they wash is a good way to help them measure if they have been scrubbing long enough.



Washing removes bacteria physically and some soaps kill bacteria. Unfortunately, most people don't wash

their hands as often as they think they do.

Wash your hands before you eat or prepare food. Wash your hands after you prepare food, use the toilet, change diapers, handle garbage or dirty dishes, touch your hair, body or other people and clean or touch dirty laundry. How to do the best job? Turn on the water as hot as you are comfortable. Wet your hands. Add soap and lather for 20 seconds. Rinse hands under water and dry with a paper towel or air dry. Source: eXtension

LIVESTOCK RELEASE

Animals staying are released Friday, June 20 at 10 PM and must be off of the Fairgrounds by Saturday, June 21 by 10 AM. Except sale animals. Swine not going through the auction are released immediately following the Sweepstakes show on Thursday, June 19.

Rabbit & Poultry Members must keep at least one animal at the Fairgrounds until release.

Rabbits & Poultry going home must be off the Fairgrounds immediately following the show.

4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION

The Livestock Auction will be Saturday, June 21 at 6pm. The Auction Committee will be retaining 3% of your total check. This helps to offset the costs of animal tags each year, as well as promoting and conducting the auction.

Your checks will be available at the Extension Office by early August.

Please be sure to personally thank your buyer the night of the auction and send them a thank you note in the mail.

Barn Bids will again be offered on animals not entered in the Livestock Auction. So, if you have more than one animal at the fair and wish to sell them through the barn you may, but once animals are signed up, no changes will be allowed.

<u>Auction</u> it is your responsibility to sign up your auction and barn animals BY NOON on FRIDAY, JUNE 20! You may only sell one animal in the 4-H Auction. If you do not sign up your animals you may be ineligible to sell or barn bid your animal.

Please personally invite potential buyers to the auction - your invitation will be more meaningful to a potential buyer than ours.



NOTE: The Auction Committee requires that all animals (including rabbits and

poultry) going through the auction must go to the designated market buyer. Rabbit and Poultry members may only sell meat animals.
