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4-H Enrollment Update!

There is still time to enroll in 4-H in 2025! To be eligible to exhibit any project at the 2025 White County 4-H Fair, youth can still enroll in White County 4-H using 4HOnline at <u>https://v2.4honline.com</u> until May 15th. Anyone who needs assistance or does not have access to 4HOnline should contact the White County Extension Office at (219) 984-5115 or stop by our office, which is located at 12 N. 25 E. in Reynolds.

A few notes about enrollment:

· For youth who were enrolled in 4-H for the 2023-2024 year, you will use the same family profile that was created last year. If you have forgotten your email or password, you should be able to reset it.

• There is a \$25 enrollment fee per member, with a maximum of \$75 per family. This fee includes the State 4-H program fee and helps to pay for the educational materials provided and events throughout the year. There is no fee for Mini 4-H (grades K-2)

 \cdot When completing online enrollment, be sure that the Emergency Contact listed is someone outside of the home that we can contact if the parents cannot be reached.

• Make sure the email you have listed in 4-H Online is up-to-date and you are checking it regularly. Many important 4-H updates are sent via email.

We hope you'll think about joining us for all that 4-H has to offer! Please don't hesitate to call or email with any questions or concerns.

Mini 4-H

Mini 4-H is for youth in Kindergarten – 2nd grade and is a great opportunity for youth who are too young to join 4-H to see what the 4-H program is all about. In White County, Mini 4-H members join and participate in a Township 4-H Club, but also will have the chance to participate in some fun Mini 4-H workshops throughout the year. Mini 4-H members can also choose to exhibit projects at the White County 4-H Fair.

Mini 4-H project options include: Animal Poster, Cake Decorating, Collections, Crafts, Creepy Crawlies, Flowers, Foods, Models, Nature/Forestry, Sewing, and Space. Mini 4-H members can also participate in Mini 4-H Animal Showmanship classes for Sheep, Goats, Dairy, Beef, Poultry, Rabbits, and Horses during the Fair. Enroll in White County Mini 4-H online at https://v2.4honline.com or by visiting the White County Extension Office, at 12 N 25 E, Reynolds, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Important Deadlines

- May 15th Last Day to Enroll in White County 4-H and be eligible to exhibit at the 2025 White County 4-H Fair (4HOnline or Extension Office)
- 🗸 May 15th Last Day to Add/Drop Projects in 4HOnline or by contacting Extension Office
- May 15th Livestock Identification deadline in 4HOnline. All livestock must be identified in 4-H online to exhibit at the White County 4-H Fair AND Indiana State Fair.
- July 1st All projects that you plan to bring to the 2025 4-H Fair due in online FairEntry program by midnight. This includes both static and livestock projects.
- July 1 Live Animal (Beef, Cat, Dairy, Dog, Goat, Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Small Animal, Swine) Educational Activities and record sheets (if applicable) due in the Extension Office by 4 PM
- July 1 Livestock Quality Assurance certification must be completed to exhibit beef, dairy, swine, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits. More information on page 7 of the newsletter.

*Please note whether the item is due to the Extension Office or in 4HOnline or FairEntry. Items due to the Extension Office must be received in the Office by the close of business (4 p.m.) on all due dates. Due to the calendar, an alternate due date will be selected for educational activities. Keep an eye on communications for more details. 4HOnline & FairEntry deadlines are midnight on the date listed.

Dog Project Update

The 4-H Dog Project provides youth a fun and hands-on learning experience that develops life skills, as well as teaches valuable information about properly caring for their animal. 4-H Academy is a program held at Purdue University which offers hands-on, exciting opportunities to dive deep into a 4-H'ers subject of choice. Participants in **grades 9-12** learn from professors, graduate students and other experts in their respective fields and participate in interactive activities and experiential learning. Participants stay in a Purdue University Residence Hall for two nights while exploring the Purdue University campus and meeting 4-H members from across Indiana.

4-H Round-Up is an opportunity for youth who have completed **grades 7, 8, and 9** to visit Purdue University's campus and explore a variety of career paths by attending hands-on classes created just for Round-Up attendees. Supported by 4-H chaperones, participants get a taste of college life by living in a Purdue Residence Hall for two nights, eating in a University dining hall, and exploring campus. Youth enjoy building friendships with 4-H'ers from across the state during recreation events planned in the evenings and blocks of free time.

The **State 4-H Band** and **State 4-H Chorus** workshops are immersive, dynamic opportunities to learn about musical performance alongside new friends from across Indiana guided by some of the best music performance teachers and staff in Indiana. Both workshops culminate in performances to over 500 people during 4-H Round-Up. State 4-H Band is a three day experience, while State 4-H Chorus is four days in length. Participants get a taste of college life by living in a Purdue Residence Hall, eating in a University dining hall, and exploring campus. Both workshops are open to all **high school age youth**; 4-H membership is not required. Each experience requires a recommendation from a band or choir director, and selection is made by the State 4-H Band and State 4-H Chorus Directors and Coordinator. Youth are afforded an opportunity to work at the **Indiana State Fair as an Exhibit Hall Worker**. Duties include checking-in non-animal 4-H exhibits, preparing exhibits for display to the public, record keeping, interacting with fair attendees, assisting with a variety of state fair events, and releasing exhibits. Workers will develop team work, customer service, record keeping, and other work related skills through this temporary employment opportunity. Exhibit Hall Workers must be a **minimum of 14 years of age**. This employment opportunity is also available to college-age young adults. Exhibit Hall Worker are expected to reside on-site in the reserved dormitory space. This is a minimum wage earning employment opportunity.

Indiana 4-H Livestock Quality Care Program

Each year, livestock exhibitors are required to complete a quality assurance program in order to show their livestock at the White County and Indiana State Fairs. This program is designed to educate producers (exhibitors) on the care of their animals in order to provide a safe product for consumers. This training is for every 4-Her in grades 3 through 12 who is exhibiting beef, dairy, sheep, swine, goats, rabbits, or poultry at the White County Fair and/or Indiana State Fair. This is a mandatory program. You must be certified in order to exhibit.

(In-Person) Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

1. Register for the event via 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com). You may only sign up for ONE training event. If you need to change your sign up, call the extension office.

2. Show up to the training, sign in, and stay for the entire length of the training.

3. Receive your training certificate from the educator. This certificate will be your proof of completion, more information on this will come during the training event. **Please make sure your email address in 4-H Online is correct.*

4. By July 1st, check your 4-H online profile under the "trainings" tab to make sure your training has been marked complete. If it is not marked complete, call the extension office.

Volunteer Information

Anyone who wishes to work with the White County 4-H program needs to be an approved 4-H Volunteer. All new volunteers can begin the enrollment process in v2.4honline.com by selecting "New Volunteer Applicant" but should also reach out to Molly Childers for more information.

All returning 4-H volunteers will need to re-enroll annually using the 4HOnline system. Volunteers should log into 4HOnline using the login email and password that was used when enrolled in 4HOnline last year. If you have forgotten your email or password or enrolled using a paper form last year, please contact the Extension Office.

REMINDER: All volunteers will be required to complete an online Youth Safety and Reporting Child Abuse training course called Operating Procedures for Programs Involving Minors. This is a policy developed by Purdue to ensure that programs involving minors are planned carefully and include safety as the highest priority. As part of this policy, all Purdue Extension Staff and Volunteers will complete this training course. Once completed, this certification will be good for 1 year. **YOU MUST COMPLETE THE TRAINING BEFORE YOUR ENROLLMENT CAN BE APPROVED.** The training can either be completed in 4HOnline or by coming into the Extension Office, and takes approximately 60 minutes to complete.

Please be sure to enroll as a 4-H Volunteer before you begin working with 4-H youth. This is for the safety of the youth and volunteers alike, and is required. Please contact the White County Extension Office at (219) 984-5115 with any questions or concerns.
