Anyone who wishes to work with the White County 4-H program needs to be an approved and enrolled White County 4-H Volunteer. All new volunteers will need to contact the White County Extension Office for information on how to complete the volunteer approval process.

All returning 4-H volunteers will need to re-enroll annually using the 4HOnline system. **Beginning October 1st**, volunteers should log into 4HOnline using the login email and password that was used when enrolled in 4HOnline last year @ v2.4honline.com.

Fair Review

We have received extensive and valuable feedback aimed at enhancing both the White County 4-H Program and the White County 4-H Fair. Our commitment to continuous growth and improvement remains steadfast each year. Below is a summary of the feedback we are currently considering as we plan enhancements for 2026.

- Ultimate Showmanship timing
- Battle of the barns- too much water
- Campground security
- Fairgrounds sound system improvements
- Broken/damaged items (benches, toilets, concrete, doors, etc.)
- 4-H Building security
- Parking in undesignated areas during fair
- Keeping livestock animals out of certain areas
 - Species need to remain in their own barn areas
 - Animals should not be walked in commercial areas of Fairgrounds or in Campground
- New poultry facilities
- · Consistency when enforcing rules
- Unauthorized items on fairgrounds (dogs, bikes, golf carts, etc.)
- Curfew enforcement
- New arena stage

We are continually growing and improving. As a reminder, White County 4-H is primarily led by volunteers, and progress requires time. If you have any feedback regarding improvements to the fair or fairgrounds, please reach out to an Ag Association Director. Should you encounter difficulties with a 4-H volunteer, do not hesitate to contact Molly Childers. Engaging in discussions on social media or other platforms will not lead to positive change and may reflect poorly on the 4-H organization as a whole. Thank you for your ongoing support of the 4-H program.
