


Image: Mini 4-H'ers David and Alvin learning about constellations at the February Mini 4-H Workshop

# 4-H Enrollment!

There is still time to enroll in 4-H in 2026! To be eligible to exhibit any project at the 2026 White County 4-H Fair, youth can still enroll in White County 4-H using 4HOnline at <https://v2.4honline.com> until May 15th. Anyone who needs assistance or does not have access to 4HOnline should contact the White County Extension Office at (219) 984-5115 or stop by our office, which is located at 12 N. 25 E. in Reynolds.

A few notes about enrollment:

- For youth who were enrolled in 4-H for the 2024-2025 year, you will use the same family profile that was created last year. If you have forgotten your email or password, you should be able to reset it.
- There is a \$25 enrollment fee per member, with a maximum of \$75 per family. This fee includes the State 4-H program fee and helps to pay for the educational materials provided and events throughout the year. There is no fee for Mini 4-H (grades K-2)
- When completing online enrollment, be sure that the Emergency Contact listed is someone outside of the home that we can contact if the parents cannot be reached.
- Make sure the email you have listed in 4-H Online is up-to-date and you are checking it regularly. Many important 4-H updates are sent via email.

# 2026 White County 4-H Handbook

Please read the 2026 requirements before starting any project. The 4-H handbook is your guide to the 4-H program, including the project exhibit requirements. If you have a specific project question, refer to your handbook first. If you cannot find the answer there, follow up with a club leader, project leader, or the extension office.

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## Important Deadlines

- ✓ **May 15th** - Last Day to Enroll in White County 4-H and be eligible to exhibit at the 2026 White County 4-H Fair (4HOnline or Extension Office)
- ✓ **May 15th** - Last Day to Add/Drop Projects in 4HOnline or by contacting Extension Office
- ✓ **May 15th** - Livestock Identification deadline in 4HOnline. All livestock must be identified in 4-H online to exhibit at the White County 4-H Fair AND Indiana State Fair.
- ✓ **July 1st** - All projects that you plan to bring to the 2026 4-H Fair due in online FairEntry program by midnight. This includes both static and livestock projects.
- ✓ **July 1** - Live Animal (Beef, Cat, Dairy, Dog, Goat, Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Small Animal, Swine) Educational Activities and record sheets (if applicable) due in the Extension Office by 4 PM
- ✓ **July 1** - Livestock Quality Assurance certification must be completed to exhibit beef, dairy, swine, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits. More information on page 7 of the newsletter.

\*Please note whether the item is due to the Extension Office or in 4HOnline or FairEntry. Items due to the Extension Office must be received in the Office by the close of business (4 p.m.) on all due dates. Keep an eye on communications for more details. 4HOnline & FairEntry deadlines are midnight on the date listed.

**Free 4-H Cords:** All 2026 White County 4-H Graduates will receive 4-H graduation cords thanks to a generous sponsor. All seniors must be enrolled in 4-H Online for 2026 by **May 1st** in order to be eligible to receive their cords. The cords will be distributed to all 4 White County public high schools. Anyone graduating from homeschool or a non-white county school will have the option to have their cords mailed or picked up from the Purdue Extension- White County Office.

# White County Queen Contest

The White County Queen Contest will take place Saturday, July 18th. Applications will be available beginning in April. Contestants must be between 18 and 22 years old by June 1, 2026 and have at least 2 years of 4-H enrollment. Junior Miss contestants must be between 15 and 17 years old by June 1st. The application process can be found on the Miss White County 4-H Fair Queen Facebook page under the "About" section. The deadline for application submission will be announced on that Facebook page.

## Indiana 4-H Livestock Quality Care Program

Each year, livestock exhibitors are required to complete a quality assurance program in order to show their livestock at the White County and Indiana State Fairs. This program is designed to educate producers (exhibitors) on the care of their animals in order to provide a safe product for consumers. This training is for every 4-Her in grades 3 through 12 who is exhibiting beef, dairy, sheep, swine, goats, rabbits, or poultry at the White County Fair and/or Indiana State Fair. **This is a mandatory program. You must be certified in order to exhibit.**

### (In-Person) Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

1. Register for the event via 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com). You may only sign up for ONE training event. If you need to change your sign up, call the extension office.
2. Show up to the training, sign in, and stay for the entire length of the training.
3. Receive your training certificate from the educator. This certificate will be your proof of completion, more information on this will come during the training event. *\*Please make sure your email address in 4-H Online is correct.*
4. By July 1st, check your 4-H online profile under the "trainings" tab to make sure your training has been marked complete. If it is not marked complete, call the extension office.


## Welcome Dionda and Marissa!

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Youth are afforded an opportunity to work at the **Indiana State Fair as an Exhibit Hall Worker**. Duties include checking-in non-animal 4-H exhibits, preparing exhibits for display to the public, record keeping, interacting with fair attendees, assisting with a variety of state fair events, and releasing exhibits. Workers will develop team work, customer service, record keeping, and other work related skills through this temporary employment opportunity.

Exhibit Hall Workers must be a **minimum of 14 years of age**. This employment opportunity is also available to college-age young adults. Exhibit Hall Worker are expected to reside on-site in the reserved dormitory space. This is a minimum wage earning employment opportunity.

## A Few Reminders:

  - Be sure to file the e-Postcard and financial forms for your Club before **May 15th!** Send a copy of each to the Extension Office for our records. All information for turning in club financial info has been emailed out.
  - If you have not yet completed the Minors Training in 4HOnline, this needs to be completed before your enrollment can be approved!
  - If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us - we are here to help!
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## Volunteer Information

Anyone who wishes to work with the White County 4-H program needs to be an approved 4-H Volunteer. All new volunteers can begin the enrollment process in [v2.4honline.com](http://v2.4honline.com) by selecting "New Volunteer Applicant" but should also reach out to Molly Childers for more information.

All returning 4-H volunteers will need to re-enroll annually using the 4HOnline system. Volunteers should log into 4HOnline using the login email and password that was used when enrolled in 4HOnline last year. If you have forgotten your email or password or enrolled using a paper form last year, please contact the Extension Office.

**REMINDER:** All volunteers will be required to complete an online Youth Safety and Reporting Child Abuse training course called Operating Procedures for Programs Involving Minors. This is a policy developed by Purdue to ensure that programs involving minors are planned carefully and include safety as the highest priority. As part of this policy, all Purdue Extension Staff and Volunteers will complete this training course. Once completed, this certification will be good for 1 year. **YOU MUST COMPLETE THE TRAINING BEFORE YOUR ENROLLMENT CAN BE APPROVED.** The training can either be completed in 4HOnline or by coming into the Extension Office, and takes approximately 60 minutes to complete.

**Please be sure to enroll as a 4-H Volunteer before you begin working with 4-H youth.** This is for the safety of the youth and volunteers alike, and is required. Please contact the White County Extension Office at (219) 984-5115 with any questions or concerns.

Thank you for volunteering with the White County 4-H Program. Without all of you, our program would not be as successful as it is!
