In this sample group rotation schedule, eight groups of 10-15 campers each rotate through nine 20-minute modules with five minutes between sessions. One "ghost group" moves through the rotation to give presenters an additional break. The eight small groups are combined into two large groups for two special sessions, an electrical safety demonstration and a Hazard Hunt. These special sessions alternate with the recreational break and the lunch break.

* Electrical Safety Demonstration—Half of the groups go to the demonstration while the other half takes a recreation break. They rotate after 30 minutes.

** Machinery Hazard Hunt—Half of the groups begin the Hazard Hunt while the other half starts lunch. The groups at the Hazard Hunt move to lunch after 15 minutes. The groups at lunch move to the Hazard Hunt when finished eating (but no later than 12:50).
