- 1) Allen County Mini 4-H Horse & Pony ID Form. Please complete and attach a <u>color photo</u> of the horse. The photo must show all four (4) feet, the face of the horse and all markings on the body of the horse. This form needs to be signed by both the Mini 4-H member and a parent/guardian.
- 2) Allen County Safety Policy for Mini 4-H Horse & Pony Members needs to be read and signed by parent/legal guardian and returned to the Extension Office by May 15.
- 3) Mini 4-H Liability Release Form: Must be completed by the parent/legal guardian and returned to the Extension Office by May 15.
- 4) 2021 Certificate of Completion needs to be completed with all <u>Required Vaccinations</u> completed and signed by 4-H member and parent. Please turn in a copy of this form to the Extension Office with all attachments by May 15, 2021. The original will need to be hand carried to all workshops.
- 5) Animal Lease Agreement If you are leasing your Horse this form must be completed and turned into the Extension Office by May 15.

ALLEN COUNTY SAFETY POLICY FOR MINI 4-H HORSE AND PONY MEMBERS

The safety and well-being of our 4-H youth is of the utmost importance.

The State 4-H Youth program at Purdue University has agreed to allow Mini 4-H members in grades K-2 to participate in some animal projects subject to certain conditions. These conditions are specified below.

- 1. Mini 4-H Horse and Pony members, in grades K through 2, will be allowed to show, work with, or care for animal projects AFTER their parent or legal guardian has signed a liability release.
- 2. The parent or legal guardian who has signed the 4-H Liability Release Form will be the <u>ONLY</u> person allowed to assist the Mini 4-H Horse and Pony member. Exception: any family with more than two mini 4-H Horse and Pony members can have a third approved handler. The alternate must submit a written statement of qualifications to be approved or denied by leaders.
- 3. The word "assist" means that the parent or legal guardian who has signed the 4-H Liability Release Form will be in control of the animal at all times.
- 4. While mounted, the Mini 4-H Horse and Pony member must wear an ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified helmet. The parent/guardian is responsible to see that this specified headgear is properly fitted with the approved harness in place and fastened whenever a rider is mounted.
- 5. The approved handler must wear long pants, boots and a long sleeve shirt while assisting the Mini 4-H Horse and Pony member in the show ring. Boots must be worn anytime while assisting throughout the week of the fair. Hats are optional for handler, but if wearing a hat must be class appropriate (no ball caps).
- 6. In addition to the helmet, all Mini 4-H Horse and Pony members must wear boots, long pants and a long sleeve shirt while in the show ring. Boots must be worn anytime while working with their animal throughout the week of the fair. Proper attire and equipment per State Class rules is required.
- 7. If the guidelines stated in this policy are not followed for a particular event or activity, then such event or activity shall NOT be considered to be a 4-H event or activity and shall not be under the auspices of the Extension 4-H educators or covered by Purdue University. Any mini participant that does not adhere to all guidelines will be issued one verbal warning by 4-H leader. Next occurrence mini will be dismissed from showing the remainder of the fair or handling their animal the remainder of the fair.
- 8. Mini 4-H Horse and Pony members will be allowed to show one (1) horse, pony or miniature horse and must select animal and submit an ID sheet by May 15, at 4:30 p.m. to the Extension Office. No substitution will be allowed without the approval of the leaders.
- 9. This is NOT a State Fair Entry.
- 10. Mini 4-H Horse and Pony members may NOT ride, walk, or lunge, etc. any other horse, pony, or miniature horse that is not identified on their ID sheet.
- 11. Members must be enrolled in the 4honline system.
- 12. All fees must be paid in full by June 30th to be eligible to show.
- 13. The classes will NOT be judged. This is a non-competitive program.
- 14. All other Allen County Horse and Pony 4-H rules apply.

Mini 4-H Liability Release Form

The safety and well being of our 4-H youth is of the utmost importance. Although kindergarten is specified as the time when a child may begin participation in some 4-H events and activities, parents are encouraged to take into consideration their child's physical and mental development before agreeing to let the child begin to show, work with, or care for animals. Each child matures at a different rate, and children in grades K-2 may still be too young to begin showing, working with, or caring for animals.

The Indiana 4-H Youth Development Program at Purdue University has agreed to allow Mini 4-H members in grades K-2 to participate in NON-COMPETITIVE animal projects subject to certain conditions. These conditions are specified below.

"Mini 4-H members, in grades K through 2, will be allowed to show, work with, or care for animal projects after their parent or legal guardian has signed a liability release. Mini 4-H members may independently show, work with, or care for animals that weigh 300 pounds or less. Mini 4-H members may only show, work with, or care for animals over 300 pounds when they are assisted by a parent, legal guardian, or another adult designated in writing by parent or legal guardian." (*The word assisted means that the adult has control of the animal at all times.*)

Mini 4-H members exhibiting horses must wear ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified helmets whenever mounted. The parent/guardian is responsible to see that this specified headgear is properly fitted with the approved harness in place and fastened whenever a rider is mounted.
