4-H COLLECTIONS PROJECT GUIDELINES AND EXHIBIT REQUIREMENTS

Your Collections exhibit should be a representative sample of your collection. If you plan to exhibit the same type of collection for more than one year, at least one/third (33%) of your exhibited items each year must be either new items added since last years 4-H Fair or items in your collection not exhibited before or a combination of both.

The **Record of New Items Added to Collection and Exhibited** sheets must be exhibited with your collection along with the completed **Record of Items in Total Collection** sheets from this and previous years in this project. These will be considered in the judging. Put a completed 4-H label on your folder and on your collection. Place your **4-H Collections Project Record** sheets in your 4-H Record book for your local 4-H leader to judge and sign.

Attach your own labels to your exhibited collected items to explain them to the public. Examples are: "Matchbook covers given to me by my father's friend." "Button from my mother's wedding dress." Be creative in arranging and labeling your exhibit in a way that is artistic and neat.

Collections Project Categories

- 1) Level 1 (Grades 3-5)
- 2) Level 2 (Grades 6-8)
- 3) Level 3 (Grades 9-12)

Requirements for each Category:

- 1) Show and explain your collection to at least two friends, your 4-H club or another group of people.
- 2) Exhibit a representative sample of your continuing collection according to guidelines above or a representative sample of a new collection you have begun.
 - a. Attach a description label to each item.
 - b. Total exhibit size will be no larger than 24" in any direction.
 - c. All exhibits must be placed within a display case or covered with heavy plastic.
 - d. If your collection is bigger than 24" in any direction or very valuable, you can exhibit a poster (22" x 28" displayed horizontally) or a notebook containing photographs of the item in your collections.
 - e. NO LIVING plants or animals may be displayed as a collection!
- 3) Exhibit in a folder your completed Record of New Items Added to Collection and Exhibited sheets from this year and the completed Record of Items in Total Collection sheets from this year and previous years in this project.
 - 4) Label both your collection and folder.

Points for you to consider when preparing your exhibit for judging

- 1) Enjoyment received from this collection-showing and explaining to friends or groups.
- 2) Completeness and accuracy of Collection sheets.
- 3) Value (historic, scientific, etc.) Quality and Care of Samples
- 4) Artistic Arrangement Labeling, Neatness, Attractiveness.

The benefits of the 4-H Collection Project:

- 1) It is fun to look for specific items for your collection and it makes you feel good to see your collection grow.
- 2) It is educational because it introduces you to new people, places and things as your find items for your collection.
- 3) It may add to your appreciation of your heritage.
- 4) It may make you more aware of the world around you.
- 5) It may sharpen your imagination.
- 6) It may help you meet other collectors.
- 7) It may not cost very much money, if any.

Storing Your Collections

It is wise to select a special place in your home to store your collection. This may be in your own room or one you share. A sturdy cardboard box, shelves, a notebook, or a bulletin board would be appropriate depending upon your collection. You may want to label your collection place so your family will know that the items placed there are special to you. If you arrange your collection attractively, they know of your interest, perhaps they will contribute items to your collection! Perhaps you and other collectors can trade items!
