Market Steer ID Day— March 7

Tagging for all dairy & beef market steers will take place on the Brown County Fairgrounds at 7 am on March 7th. Steers must be tagged on this day to meet the March 15th 4HOnline ID deadline. Market Steers refers to cattle being sold in the Livestock Auction. Feeder Calves and Heifers will be tagged May 3rd. Consult your 4-H Handbook pg. 60 for all ID requirements.

New this year: The Indiana State Fair is adding a market heifer class. If you are planning to show a market heifer at the State Fair that animal will need to be tagged March 7th in order to meet the March 15th 4HOnline ID deadline as well. At this time, Heifers are not eligible to be sold in the Brown County 4-H Livestock Auction. If there is significant interest the Extension Office, Livestock Auction Committee and Council may review the policies to accommodate such a class.

Tagging and weigh in for all other livestock will take place May 3rd.

Health Benefits of Soup

It's no surprise that soup is usually a go-to during the colder fall and winter months. There are so many different combinations, nearly all of them are one pot meals (or so convenient that they can be made in a slow cooker), and soups are an easy way to get in your servings of veggies when fresh summer produce isn't available. There are even health benefits to eating soup. Regularly eating soup might help you shed some unwanted pounds and help you get over a cold faster.

BROCCOLI POTATO SOUP

Ingredients

- 4 cups broccoli (chopped)
- 1 small onion (chopped)
- 4 cups low-sodium chicken (or vegetable) broth
- 1 cup nonfat evaporated milk
- 1 cup dehydrated potatoes prepared with 1 cup water, or 4 potatoes diced
- salt and pepper (to taste) 1/4 cup shredded cheese (like cheddar or American)


Directions

- Combine broccoli, onion, and broth in large sauce pan. Bring to a boil.
- Reduce heat, cover, and simmer until vegetables are soft (about 10 minutes).
- 3. Add milk, then slowly stir in potatoes.
- 4. Cook, stirring constantly, until bubbly and thickened.
- Stir in a little more milk or water if soup becomes too thick. Add salt and pepper to taste
- 6. Spoon into bowls and top with 1 tablespoon cheese.




