June 15

4HOnline Target Deadline for Adding/Dropping 4-H Projects

Please finalize your 4-H project selections by this date. I have to import your projects from 4HOnline into FairEntry which means you need to finalize your projects on 4HOnline before entering them on FairEntry. The office is ready to help you with project book pick ups, poster boards and any help you may need.

FairEntry Opens

The FairEntry website that we have used for several years will be the collection point for the virtual fair. Each specific project is being modified to include questions asking you to upload the appropriate photos/videos with your entry. You will log in with your 4HOnline user name and password and create entries like normal with the new addition of uploading multimedia content. A document listing out what content is needed for each project will be released very soon, we are meeting with Judges and Project leaders to finalize this document now.

Indiana 4-H Online Animal Ethics Training is Due for County Only Livestock Exhibitors

This year the requirement to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals has been replaced for county-only exhibitors. All livestock members must complete either YQCA or the Indiana 4-H Online Animal Ethics program in order to exhibit. Members do not have to complete both programs. See page 6 for more information.

Online Judging Begins

Judges will use this week to review your submissions, fill out scoresheets and upload the results into FairEntry.

Results will be posted in on a FairEntry site

All results will be complied into one "live" website from FairEntry were you can see all the submissions and results in one place. There is an option on FairEntry for you to select if you do not wish that your photos are shared publically. This site will be published after online judging closes.

Daily videos of 4-H Livestock Shows will be posted to social media following the traditional fair schedules

The 4-H Livestock & Animal Show submissions will be edited together into videos that will be posted on the traditional fair schedule. The Goat Show will be published on Tuesday and the Cattle show will be published on Wednesday for example. There will be alternations to the show schedule for the events that traditionally happen prior to fair. For example, the Horse Show will be moved to be included during Fair Week. This is my goal, if I can't edit the videos fast enough there might be some delays.

4-H Exhibit Hall Projects will be published to a photo gallery site I am working on developing. There will also be a video of submissions and results posted during Fair Week.
