Your animals must be enrolled and your profile must be active in order to exhibit at the State Fair or Brown County.

• You must complete your required **Animal Ethics** component by reviewing the <u>Indiana 4-H Animal Ethics Module</u> <u>here</u> and completing the <u>brief quiz here</u>.



July 20th is the last day you can exhibit your projects! Judges will then have 5 days to evaluate and provide feedback on your projects. Results will go live following the schedule on Page 2. 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# **Brown County Mini 4-H Non-Competitive Policy**

Mini 4-H is a program designed to encourage positive development of children, kindergarten, first and second grade. The goal of Mini 4-H is to help young children explore friendships outside the family; explore the way in which things work; practice both small and large muscle control; and think about the ways people work together on projects. The non-competitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

- 1. Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
- 2. Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual, positive encouragement and assistance.
- 3. Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
- 4. Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and/or displaying their activity projects.
- 5. Rewards are identical and/or ribbons of the same color for everyone. Mini 4-H exhibits will not be judged projects, but instead judges will discuss the exhibit with the child.

## Mini 4-H Project Ideas

#### Animal Posters/Journal:

Create an poster or Journal about your favorite pet or livestock animal. Include photos, your animals name and some facts you've learned about your animal this year.

#### Collections:

Click the link for a Collections Activity Book. Or explore your environment by collecting rocks or leaves then ask an adult to help you identify them! Make a poster or display box to display your collection and what you have learned.

## Mini 4-H Arts & Crafts Project Idea





#### Marbled Shaving Cream Art

- 1a. Put shaving cream on a cookie sheet or surface that will not stain.
- 1b. Spread the cream till the top is flat, don't squish!
- 2. Drop food coloring or acrylic paint on the cream.
- 3. Use a tooth pick to swirl the coloring into whatever design you would like.
- 4. Gently place paper on top of cream and lift up slowly.
- 5. Wipe away excess cream and you've created your own masterpiece!

## Where can I see Judges Comments?

Judges will be providing in depth comments on your projects on the FairEntry site. After results are published you can login to FairEntry again, click your entries and review Judges Comments.

## What if I want to enter my projects but don't want the pictures shared publically?

When completing your entry in entry details select "no" when asked "allow public viewing?" Email copelanb@purdue.edu if you are unsure if you made this selection.

## Where do I go to get help with FairEntry?
