YOUTH FOR OUALITY CARE & ANIMALS Goal:

The cicadas are coming after a 17-year hiatus!

A natural wonder will occur in 15 states this year: the emergence of the Brood X, 17-year periodical cicadas. Also known as the "17-year or 13-year locusts" the last mass emergence of these insects occurred in 2004. Now, 17 years later, the immature cicadas will emerge from the ground, molt one last time to gain wings, and "sing" loudly to find mates and lay eggs in trees and woody shrubs.

Stakeholders with young ornamental, nursery or fruit trees are most likely to be impacted. Purdue Extension Entomology has a wide-range of resources available, which they will feature over the next couple of months. Cicadas will be emerging in late May through June in all Indiana counties, but activity will be heaviest in south-central Indiana. Although periodical cicadas do not bite or sting people, or pets, the bad news is that females lay eggs in 200 plus wood tree species and can cause severe damage to young trees.

Boiler Butcher Basics Purdue Department of Animal Sciences

<u>What:</u> The Boiler Butcher Basics course is designed to give hands-on training in harvest, fabrication, and processing of pork, poultry, lamb/goat, and beef to anyone interested in learning these critical skills. This course is designed for those needing job training, or those that want to understand more about raising and harvesting their own meat.

<u>When:</u> This program will be offered four times in the spring/summer with each session focusing on 1 specie. The sessions for pork, lamb/goat, and beef will be 2-day sessions, and poultry will be a 1-day session. Each session will have separate registration fees and participants can register for more than one session if desired. Each session will take place 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM on the following dates:

May 13-14: Pork May 20: Poultry June 3-4: Lamb/Goat June 17-18: Beef

<u>Where:</u> All sessions will take place in the Land O' Lakes Inc. Center for Experiential Learning, Purdue University (address: 720 Clinic Drive, West Lafayette, Indiana 47907-2041). Parking will be in the Harrison Street Parking Garage across the street.

<u>Fees:</u> All 2-day sessions are \$300 each, and the 1-day session is \$150. Fees cover program costs, reference materials, food, beverages, and parking in the Harrison Street Parking Garage. Participants will be provided all meat cutting and personal safety equipment, except footwear. Refund and Cancellation Policy: All cancellations are subject to a 12% registration fee + \$5 processing fee. NO REFUNDS will be processed after June 14, 2021.
