Exhibit Guidelines:

All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

Exhibit Class Guidelines:

• Beginner (grades 3-5)

Complete one of the following exhibits:

- Display a poster identifying five (5) different types of recyclable materials. Provide an
 example of each and a brief description of how they should be prepared before being
 turned in to the recycling center.
- Exhibit an article made from discarded paper, plastic, and/or metal. Include a brief
 description of how you made the item. Projects will be judged on creativity and
 originality.

• Intermediate (grades 6-8)

Complete one of the following exhibits:

- Exhibit an article or display made of discarded paper, plastic and/or metal (includes aluminum) items. Include a brief description of your exhibit. Projects will be judged on creativity and originality.
- Do a poster on any recycling topic of your choice.

Advanced (grades 9-12)

Complete one of the following exhibits:

- Exhibit an article or display made of any discarded items. Include a brief description of your exhibit. Projects will be judged on creativity and originality.
- Do a poster on any recycling topic of your choice.

Clay County Requirement:

You will need to have a filled-out project record sheet to turn in with your project at judging.
