
PURDUE EXTENSION MASTER GARDENER PROGRAM

- Purdue Extension's Master Gardener Program trains gardening enthusiasts as volunteers to share home-horticulture education across Indiana's communities.
- In 2019, nearly 3,000 active Purdue Extension Master Gardener volunteers clocked over 175,000 volunteer hours worth more than \$4 million to Indiana's economy.
- Master Gardeners also donated 73,052 pounds of produce in 2019 from their educational demonstration gardens to local food banks helping fight food insecurity.

GROWING TOGETHER PROJECT

- The Growing Together Project increases access to fruits and vegetables in food pantries by building and maintaining community donation gardens.
- This collaborative project comprising six Midwest states is facilitated in Indiana by Purdue Extension's Nutrition Education Program (SNAP-Ed) and Master Gardener Program. During the 2020 growing season, 14 Indiana counties participated in a total of 21 gardens.
- Nearly 7,200 pounds of produce was grown, donated and distributed to 33 organizations increasing access to fresh produce for 10,000 Indiana residents.

From 2019-2020, Extension assisted with **329** community gardens statewide:

creating **356** unique partnerships and leading to the production of more than **1 MILLION** servings of food.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- Purdue Extension's Master Gardener Program hosted 495 students virtually in its first statewide training to prepare new volunteers to assist residents in their communities.
