1. Go to FairEntry.com
 2. Select "Find Your Fair" and find the 2021 Harrison County 4-H Fair
 3. Select the GREEN box to sign in with your 4-H Online credentials
 4. Choose that you would like to register as an individual
 5. Choose the dot next to the name of the member you are registering and click "continue"
 6. Answer any required questions and review the exhibitor registration info, making any necessary corrections. DO NOT transfer to your 4-H Online account.
 7. Click "Continue to Entries"
 8. Click "Add an Entry" box to the right of the exhibitor's name
 9. Select the Department, Division, and Class you would like to enter
 10. To correct errors, click the "Change" button. Once reviewed click "Continue"
 11. Select the 4-H Club you are in and click "Continue"
 12. Enter the description of your exhibit and click "Continue"
 13. Answer any additional questions required for that entry and click "Continue"
 14. Decide if you'd like to add another entry, register another exhibitor, or continue to payment
 15. To register an animal entry from your 4-H Online account, select "Add an Animal".
 16. Click "Choose an Existing Animal Record" box to enter an animal that was identified in 4-H Online.
 17. Select the animal you would like to enter.
 18. If you want to switch to a different animal, click "Remove From Entry Box". If correct, click "Continue"
 19. Review your invoice, either in summary format or detail format. If correct, click "Continue"
 20. Select the green "Continue" box
 21. Confirm your entries one last time. You can see a summary of exhibitors in your family, or their entries in detail. Make sure all entries for each exhibitor in your family are listed before you submit the entries.
Once you submit, you cannot edit your entries.
 22. Click continue to confirm and **submit** your entries by clicking the green "Submit" button.

4-H Livestock Auction Photos



There will be NO photographer to take auction photos at the fair this year!

If you are planning to auction an animal at this year's fair, you must upload your auction photo when you make your entry. No auction photos will be taken at this year's fair. This gives you the opportunity to pose, smile, and share your personality to the buyers. The photos you submitted last year were awesome! We encourage you to upload a photo of each of your market animals that are eligible for the auction. You may win a species grand champion and wish to change your sale animal. The office staff will be printing the auction photos in advance of fair this year, and this will ensure that we have the information we need to make those changes quickly for you.

YQCA

ALL youth participating in livestock projects are **REQUIRED** to complete the YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) certification for project completion. The certification can be completed online (\$12) or in face-to-face classes (\$3). Test out options are available online only (not available for junior level). YQCA is an online based program and will require an online profile for certification. The Harrison County 4-H Council voted to purchase coupon codes for 4-H Youth members in livestock projects. Please check dates with your FFA advisor for additional offerings. Pre-registration is **REQUIRED** through YQCA.org.

Animal Identification

4-H Members (Grades 3-12) must identify all Beef and Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Sheep, and Swine in the 4-H Online system by May 15th to be eligible for exhibition. Complete the following steps to identify your livestock on v2.4HOnline.com. Please contact your species superintendent with questions.

1. Login to your family profile at v2.4HOnline.com
 - a. If you've forgotten your password, please use the 'Reset Password' option on v2.4HOnline.com and you will be sent a new temporary password.
 - b. If you've forgotten your email, please call the Purdue Extension Office.
2. Click "View" next to the Member's record from whom you would like to add an animal.
3. Click Animals in the navigation pane.
4. Click the blue Add an Animal button.
5. Click on Add New Animal to start adding a new animal.
6. Select the appropriate animal type from the drop down menu.
7. Enter the required Tag, Tattoo, or Animal Name and Click Save.
8. Read the instructions for Animal ID requirements for County Fair and Indiana State Fair Exhibition.
9. Click "Show Questions" after reading the instructions.
10. Required fields are indicated, but be sure to complete all other visible fields as applicable.
11. Click next once completed.
12. Upload any files necessary for the particular Animal type.
13. Click next once completed.
14. Once the entered information is correct and reviewed, click the Submit button.
15. The animal info will display on the screen with the status, created, modified, and submitted date and time stamp (local time). You will also receive a confirmation email upon submission.
16. To add more animals for the same member repeat steps 3-17. To add animals for another member return to the Member List and View another member.

4-H 4 Challenge

Starting May 1st, you will have the opportunity to take part in the Indiana "4-H 4 Challenge!" 4-H members will be able to complete a variety of tasks in the areas of civic engagement, STEM, healthy living, and personal 4-H experiences. The challenges will be split into three grade level groups: 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12.

The first 50 4-H members who complete at least 3 of the 4 main challenges and 4 of the bonus challenges will be awarded a free 4-H t-shirt! Of these winners, three grand prize winners will be awarded a cash prize! Cash prize winners will be determined by a team of youth judges and 4-H staff, and will be notified that they are a winner by June 1.
