Get Up to Date!



4HOnline

Check your 4HOnline.com status! Be sure that your status is active before May 15th. Also make sure that you have entered your exhibit hall projects, animal projects, and animal ID by the specified deadlines. Exhibit Hall projects are due by **May 15th**. Check your 2019 4-H Handbook for your animal project deadlines.

Fair Entry

Go to FairEntry.com and enter the projects you intend to exhibit. Fair entry will closed **May 28th**. Remember that the Extension Office will be closed May 27th for Memorial Day. Don't wait until the last few days! The system can overload or be slow if too many people wait until the last minute. **Late entries won't be accepted**. It's best to enter in your projects in **now!**

T-Shirts

Get your T-shirt size in before **May 15th!** Here are the four simple steps that will get you to your registration:

1. Log in to your account at www.4HOnline.com
2. Click "Continue as Family"
3. Scroll down to "Register a Member for an Event"
4. Choose the member's name and "2019 T-Shirt Registration" and follow the prompts from there.

YQCA

If you are a 4-H member with a livestock project you are required to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certification for project completion. Certifications can be online (\$12) or in person (\$3). The Harrison County 4-H Council has purchased coupon codes for 4-H Youth Members and are available at the office. The last in person training is **May 21st** from 6PM to 7PM at the Extension Office.

Youth Safety

4-H Adult Volunteers! Is your Youth Safety Training up-to-date? This training must be renewed every two years. To check your status or complete the online training, log into 4HOnline.com, choose edit next to your name, and click on the Trainings Tab.

Poultry Blood Testing

May 23rd from 6PM to 9 PM at the Poultry Barns

SPARK Clubs

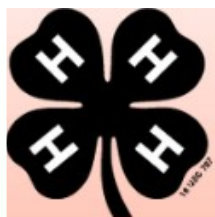


Interested in Starting a SPARK Club?

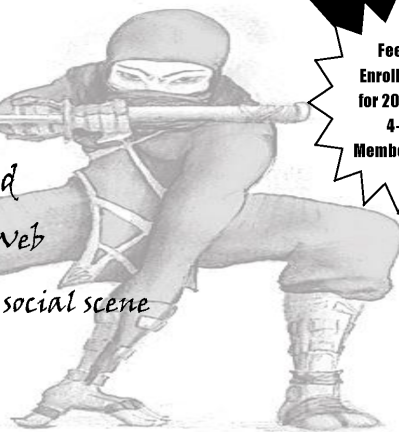

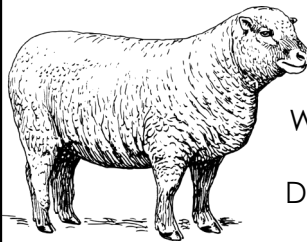

Harrison County Cattlemen's Association's Working Chute Contest

June 15th at 6:00 PM at the 4-H Show Pavilion

To enter, you must have a team of two youth members and one adult OR three youth team members that are Harrison County Junior Cattlemen's Association Members. Youth must be current members of either 4-H or FFA and in 3rd through 12th grade. Adult participants must be over the age of 18 and not a current 4-H or FFA member.

Contest Fees: \$30 per team. Max of 10 teams.

Registration Open May 1st through June 14th.

Pay Out Scale: \$200 to the Winning Team.

1st place \$75. 2nd place \$60. 3rd place \$45. 4th place \$30

Master Showmanship

This contest is to expand and improve all livestock showmanship skills, to increase an appreciation for all livestock species, and to develop a cooperative spirit among 4-H members.

Participants

- The premier showman of the Beef, Dairy Females, Dairy Steers, Meat Goat, Sheep, and Swine will be eligible to compete for the Large Animal Master Showman. The premier showman of Dairy Goats, Poultry, Pygmy Goats, and Rabbits will be eligible for Small Animal Master Showman. **Western Type, Hunter Type, and Saddle Type Premier Showman are eligible for Horse & Pony Master Showman.**
- If a species Premier Showman declines to compete, the alternate may compete in Master Showman. If both the Premier Showman AND the alternate decline, that species will not be represented in the Master Showman contest.
- If a showman wins more than one Premier Showmanship, they must decide which species they will represent.
- 4-H members will be lettered A through F for large animal and A through D for small animal. Show cards will be provided and the 4-H member will draw their letter on the day of the show. This does not apply to Horse and Pony Showman.
- After the contest starts, the 4-H member is not allowed to leave the ring.
- No talking to parents/ guardians after the contest begins.
- You are to wear your 4-H T-shirt, jeans and boots. NO hats or tennis shoes. This does not apply to Horse and Pony Showman who are expected to wear appropriate showmanship clothing according to their discipline.
- Water will be provided during the show if needed.
- **A 4-H member is only allowed to win Master Showman one time per category in their 4-H career. A member may win once in large animal and once in small animal and once in horse and pony. A member may still compete in their species showmanship, but is not eligible to win master a second time.**

Harrison County Agricultural Society Membership



Membership is open to anyone and is \$25 per person. This membership includes daily admission to the fair and all exhibits, a general admission seat on the grandstand, free parking and voting privilege at the annual meeting in November to elect fair board members (rides NOT included). The cost of admission to the fair is \$10 daily, Monday through Saturday, which then provides unlimited rides, general admission seat on the grandstand, free parking, admission to all exhibits. 2019 HCAS ~ 4-H Pass Policy

The policy for the 4-H Family Livestock Pass shall read as:

One pass will be issued per 4-H livestock family who has 4-H members with livestock on exhibit during the Harrison County Fair **who have no other daily pass available**, to include 4-H Adult Volunteer Pass, HCAS Vendor Pass, HCAS Membership Pass, or any other daily pass which may be developed. This will expand the 4-H passes from two categories to three categories of passes: 4-H Adult Volunteer Pass, 4-H Member Pass, 4-H Family Livestock Pass. The only gate that will accept any of the three types of 4-H Passes will be the North Gate entrance by the 4-H Swine Barn. Each of the three passes will receive a punch-type pass, which will be hole-punched upon entry for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of the HCAS Fair. Two of the pass types will have only one name on them: 4-H Member Pass and the 4-H Adult Volunteer Pass. The 4-H Family Livestock Pass may have up to three names listed depending on the family's preference as to who may come to assist the 4-H member with livestock during the HCAS Fair. Two 4-H pass types will require photo ID for entry: 4-H Adult Volunteer Pass and the 4-H Family Livestock Pass. 4-H Member passes will **not** require photo identification. The Harrison County Extension Office must work with the HCAS to complete names on passes of currently enrolled 4-H members and 4-H Adult Volunteers no later than May 15, 2019 to the HCAS board. The Harrison County Extension Office must provide a list, which includes the names (only up to 3 allowed) for each 4-H Family Livestock Pass.

The 4-H Family Livestock Pass is good for only one of the three persons listed on the card each day. The 4-H Family Livestock Pass will be issued at the HCAS Fair Office under the grandstand and it is strongly suggested that the passes be picked up prior to Monday at 4:00 PM when gate admission is required to enter. The families allowed the 4-H Family Livestock Pass shall not have access to any other daily pass.

Any name submitted for the 4-H Family Livestock Pass that is also on the 4-H Adult Volunteer list, HCAS vendor list, HCAS membership list will not be allowed a 4-H Family Livestock Pass.

Homemaker's Pass list will also be consulted prior to issuing the 4-H Family Livestock Pass, and in the case of crossover, the person would receive the 4-day 4-H Family Livestock Pass instead of the two one-day Homemaker exhibit pass. All three 4-H pass types allow for entrance to the premises only and do not allow for admittance on the grandstand, the pit pass area, the rides or any other paid attraction during the fair. Any person admitted with any of the three 4-H Passes (4-H Member Pass, 4-H Adult Volunteer Pass, 4-H Family Livestock Pass) must request a stamp on their hand if they exit and hope to re-enter on the same day. Failure to do so will require the person who exits to pay the full \$10 to re-enter on the same day. Anyone who leaves the HCAS premise after 4:00 PM may not re-enter without a stamp on their hand PLUS show their 4-H pass **or** pay the full \$10 entry fee, without exception.
