Dear 4-H Families:

It is time to start thinking about the 2021 Jackson County Fair! We will once again be utilizing Fair Entry to help us organize project check in and be able to enter results in a timely manner during fair. 4-H Online helps us manage the projects and clubs in which your child participates, but Fair Entry will help us manage the actual exhibits they bring to the fair.

Fair Entry will open June 25th and close on July 9th. By July 9th, we need each family to log into https://jacksoncountyindiana.fairentry.com and register each of the exhibits your child plans to bring. Every project (4-H Building Project and Animals) must be entered in Fair Entry. In 4-H Online, you selected the general projects your child planned to complete (example: Foods or Woodworking), but in Fair Entry, you will tell us exactly what classes in which they plan to exhibit (example: Foods, Level A, Three Muffins or Woodworking, Level D, Picnic Table). You will use the same log in information that you created for 4-H Online. Thorough instructions for completing your Fair Entry registration are included in this mailing. Read these carefully to help with the process.

As with 4-H Online, we have computers set up in the office for your use. You can stop by our office between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. if you would like to use one of our computers or receive assistance in creating your entries. We will also be hosting two evenings with extended office hours this summer to better serve you!

Monday, June 28th: Extension Office open until 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 6th: Extension Office open until 6:00 p.m.

What can you do during extended office hours?

Receive Fair Entry assistance, purchase project supplies (cake decorating kits, posters, sleeves, entomology boxes, electric kits), pay auction consignment fees, etc. We know it is sometimes hard for families to visit us during office hours, so we are staying open late on the two dates listed above!

What if your child changes their mind or you entered the wrong exhibit in Fair Entry? Contact the Extension Office at 812-358-6101 and we can make those changes for you. The deadline for adding and dropping projects was May 15th, so we cannot add additional projects, just change the exhibit entry for projects youth are already enrolled in.

See the enclosed document for county and state project information, as that will help you in entering projects and knowing where they are located in the Fair Entry system.

Fair Entry Information

Project Check In will look a little different this year for 4-H Building Projects and Animal Projects. We will be fully utilizing the Fair Entry system to be able to check in projects, build show programs, quickly record 4-H results, and publish results for the public to view. Not much is going to change for families, but we do need you to enter projects in Fair Entry by July 9th to help us with this process.

Project Check in Process for 4-H Building Projects:

The back of the 4-H Building will serve as the main check in hub for 4-H Building Projects. All youth will need to first visit this station to get checked in. Once you have been checked in by staff members or 4-H Volunteers, then you can take your projects to the designated areas to be judged or drop off projects for closed judging. You will need to present the Fair Entry card for each project you receive at the main check in hub in order for your projects to be judged or checked in for closed judging.

If you do not pre-register your exhibits in Fair Entry by July 9th, you will need to do that on project check in day. Save yourself (and us!) time by doing this ahead of the deadline so you are ready to be checked in and get your projects judged in a timely manner. It is much quicker and easier to enter projects at home rather than waiting to get it done on project check in day during the heat of the summer. We will be using barcodes and scanners to get you and your projects checked in for the fair! All we need you to do is register your projects in Fair Entry and we will take care of the rest!

For your convenience, information about Project Check In is included in this letter and will be published again in the July – August – September 4-H Clover Connections Newsletter.

Project Check in Process for 4-H Animal/Livestock Projects:

Be on the lookout for a separate livestock mailing with important livestock information regarding auction consignment, barn clean up dates, etc.

NEW for 2021: Every child showing an animal at the Jackson County Fair will receive a packet of information that includes: livestock parking passes, 4-H event schedule, back numbers, etc. These packets will be ready to be picked up on project check in day – Wednesday, July 21st when you drop off other 4-H Projects or your green folders and animal project manuals.

If you do not pre-register your animal/livestock exhibits by July 9th, you will not be able to pick up your livestock packet on project check in day. You will need to visit the check in hub to get your animals entered in Fair Entry and then you will be able to receive your livestock packet for the fair.

We are working to make some changes to our fair processes to make it more efficient for 4-H Volunteers, 4-H Families, and office staff. We know there are a lot of due dates, rules to abide by, and procedures to follow for 4-H families. Thank you for the feedback you all have given over the past few years. It has helped us implement some changes to better serve you!

Register all 4-H projects/events for the Jackson County Fair between June 25th and July 9, 2021

1. Go to http://jacksoncountyindiana.fairentry.com



- Select your "Sign in with your 4-H Online account options – the GREEN box
- 3. A separate box will pop up where you can enter the login email address and password from 4HOnline.

(If you don't remember your password, you will need to select the "I forgot my password" option to get a temporary one emailed to you. If your email address has changed, log in using the old email address and change it in 4HOnline.)

- 4. Click the "Login" box.
- 5. This will take you to the Welcome screen, where you will need to select the green box to "Begin Registration"

6. Choose if you would like to register an individual or a team and click that green box




7. Choose the dot next to the name of the 4-H'er you would like to register and then click the green "continue" box.

Please do not create any exhibitors from scratch, as you will not be able to add exhibits for the projects you are enrolled in.

- 8. Answer any required questions and review the exhibitor registration information.
- 9. Make any necessary corrections (using the edit boxes). Remember that any corrections made here DO NOT transfer back to your 4HOnline Account
- If Additional questions are required by your county, complete the questions and then select the green "Continue" box
- 11. When you are taken back to the Exhibitor information page, click the green "Continue to Entries" button


SECTION 2 - ENTRIES TAB

- 13. Click the green "Select" box next to the Department you would like to enter






14. Click the green "Select" box next to the Division you would like to enter



- 17. Select the dot next to the 4-H Club that you belong to and then select the green "Continue" box










18. If required, enter in a description of your exhibit and click Continue— please be specific as this description for non-animal exhibits will be used to distinguish between exhibits, example — don't just type in "photo", type in more description, such as "Butterfly on leaf photo"




- 19. Answer any Additional Questions required for that entry and then click the green "Continue" box.










23. A list of those animals that you have previously ID'd in 4-H Online that are eligible for that class are listed. Select the circle next to the animal you would like to enter. Then select the green "Select Animal" box.



24. All of the information about that animal will be pulled over from 4-H Online, so that you can check to make sure that is the correct animal. If you want to switch to a different animal, click on the "remove from entry box". If it is correct, click the green "Continue" box. Then you will be taken to the Additional Questions page listed in step #20.




SECTION 3 - PAYMENT TAB

***The payment section is a formality of the system. No payment is needed, but you must go through the steps to submit your entries. It is best to enter all entries for all exhibitors in your family before completing the Payment and submission steps.


- 25. Review your invoice, either in summary format or detail format. If it looks correct, click the green "Continue" box. If not, go back to the entries tab and fix what you need to.
- 26. Select the green "Continue box.
 - **There are no fees for 4-H exhibits.

27. Confirm your entries one last time. You can see a summary of exhibitors in your family, or their entries in detail. Make sure all entries for each exhibitor in your family are listed before you submit the entries.




28. Click Continue to confirm and submit your entries.



29. Click the Submit button to submit your entries.



30. You will receive a "Thanks!" message. You can choose the button to "Visit Dashboard" to see your entry.



You will receive an email from Fair Entry after your entry has been submitted.

You will also receive an email from Fair Entry letting you know if your entry was approved or rejected by the County Extension Staff. If part of your entry was rejected, a reason will be listed and you will be able to log in and fix the problem before submitting that entry again. Mission & Vision of Indiana 4-H


Developing Life Skills through the Indiana 4-H Program
