

Livestock/ Animal Project Update

Beef Tagging—February 26, 2022, 7 -10 am on the Fairgrounds

Save the date! Any youth planning to show a beef steer, heifer, and or dairy steer at the 4-H County Fair this summer must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Dairy Females and previously shown and tagged females with appropriate registration/identification information do not need to come to tagging.

Sheep, Goat, Swine Tagging—April 30, 2022, 7 –10 am on the Fairgrounds

Save the date! Any youth planning to show sheep, goats, or swine at the 4-H County Fair this summer must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Previously shown females that have the proper ID do not need to come to tagging.



Livestock Exhibitor Check List

The following is a list to help you manage your 4-H Livestock Project. Complete rules are listed in your 4-H Handbook. If you have questions or need help please reach out to the Extension Office or your Livestock Superintendent.

✓ Tag your Livestock at Tagging/ID Day

- Animal ID Requirement— <u>If you plan to or are thinking about showing at the state fair</u> let your live-stock superintendent know at tagging in order to receive additional tags and have a DNA Hair sample collected and submitted to the Extension office <u>at tagging</u>. Premise ID Requirement— Premise ID's indicate where an animal originates in case a disease needs to be traced back to it's source and are required by State Law. You can look up or apply for a new Premise ID by going to https://www.in.gov/boah/. You only need one Premise ID for all the animals raised at the same address. <u>Bring this number with you to tagging</u>. Contact the office if you need help.
- **Born & Bred** If your animal is Born and Bred, turn in the B&B form at tagging. Forms are available at the office or at tagging, see handbook for complete B&B rules.
- ✓ Complete a Lease Agreement & Submit to the Extension office if you plan to lease an Animal by May 1st.
- Enroll your Animal on 4HOnline by May 15th (May 16th this year because it falls on a Sunday)
 - All animals except rabbits, chickens, dogs & cats must be enrolled on 4HOnline. To enroll
 you will need:
 - Tag Numbers or Appropriate ID

 given at ID Day
 - Premise ID Number

 given by BOAD
 - Weight– if taken at ID Day
 - Birthdate

Complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Training

YQCA is a required training for all Indiana 4-H members who exhibit
Dairy, Beef, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep and Swine. 4-H Members can
take YQCA online for \$12 or attend an in person training for \$3 on the

✓ Complete Fair Entry between <u>June 1– July 1</u>

 You must select your classes for your livestock projects before check in so we can print check in papers, show bills, auction bills and more. A link will be shared on June 1st for you to complete this important step.

Free Fentanyl Test Strips—information provided by HCI



In the last quarter of 2021, Jefferson County experienced a rash of drug overdoses, allegedly due to fentanyl laced counterfeit opioids. The U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency also issued a rare national alert in order to raise awareness to this problem.

The State of Indiana is partnering with Lifeline Overdose to provide FREE test strips to test drugs for fentanyl before taking any suspicious drug or drugs of unknown origin. The strips are ordered from the Overdose Lifeline website. As a reminder, naloxone, a life saving drug for persons experiencing a drug overdose, is available for free from a box on the LifeSpring Health Systems building, located at 1405 Bear St, Madison. 
