

4-H SCHOLARSHIP & DEVELOPMENT FUND

Jefferson County 4-H'ers, 4-H Fair Board, and the Community Foundation of Madison and Jefferson County, Inc. have joined resources to establish a permanent Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund includes:

- 4-H Scholarship Fund Scholarships are awarded to 4-H'ers who wish to attend college or trade school after graduation.
- 4-H Development Fund used for 4-H Fairgrounds improvement and to support 4-H'ers for trips, camp, and conferences.

The Community Foundation administers the 4-H Endowment which grants money to 4-H while returning capital gains to the fund to protect its purchasing power. Respected members of the community make up an Advisory Board who decide exactly how the proceeds from the fund will be spent. Donors can designate their money to go to Scholarships and/or Development.



Sample from Dinosaur Book

How to Make a Dinorama:

- 1. Get a cardboard box and cut out the front leaving a 4" lip.
- 2. Paint the box to look like the Earth at the time the dinosaurs were alive. (Use resource books for this.)
- 3. Collect soil for the bottom of the box. Put in enough soil (about 2 inches deep). Make hills, lakes, swamps, etc. Use a mirror or poster board painted blue for water. Collect rocks and place in dinorama.
- 4. Collect plants such as small branches, leaves and other plant material. (Get help from your parents for this.)
- 5. Place models of dinosaurs similar to those who would have lived in the habitat you have made.






Sample from Flower Project



Remember the fork and napkin are always on the left and the knife, spoon, and glass are on the right. Sample from Pebble Pups Project

Color Sorting

Key Ideas:

- ❖ To learn that rocks are composed of minerals which have colors inside which are different from the external colors of the rocks.
- ❖ To learn that some rocks can be identified on the basis of their internal color.

Activities

Supplies you will need:

Hand lens

Sand

Paper

Pieces of unglazed tile 12 rocks

Color Sorting

Rocks are composed of minerals. Some minerals can be identified by their color because some minerals always have the same color. Certain rocks can be identified by the color streak they leave when scratched on a piece of tile. This "streak" is from the powder from the mineral and usually is different from the external color of the rock.

- A. Sort your rocks into colors. Put the same colors together.
- B. Scratch each rock sample across a piece of unglazed tile and record the color streak for each.
- C. Compare and match the color of the sample with colors listed below. Identify the mineral the rock contains. Repeat for each of the rock samples you have.
- D. Put in an egg carton and identify the mineral from the list below.



Let's Make a Pin Cushion

Items needed:

- $\times 1 3$ inch foam ball
- Medium weight knit fabric −
 any color at least 12 inches wide and
 12 inches long
- ∠Large eyed needle or #14 arts & crafts needle
- >< Scissors
- ★ Tailor's chalk



- 1. Fold your fabric in half.
- 2. Cut out the half-circle, which is in the manual, and place the pattern on the fold of your fabric.
- 3. With straight pins, pin the pattern in place on the fabric.
- 4. Very carefully cut around the pattern, keeping the fabric flat on the cutting surface. Open up your fabric and you will have a circle.
- 5. With the tailor's chalk, mark the broken lines on your fabric circle in the same places they are found on your pattern. About 1 ½" from the edge.
- 6. Thread your needle. If you are using yarn, use a #14 arts & crafts needle. If you are sewing with embroidery floss, use a doubled thread and a crewel or large eyed needle. You may need an adult to help you get the yarn or floss through the eye of the needle.
- 7. Following the broken lines on the fabric, very carefully make your basting stitches. Try to keep them all about the same size. Be sure you stitch all the way around the circle.
- 8. With your parent's help, take a knife and cut approximately 1/4" off the bottom of the foam ball. Make the edge even so the ball will not roll.
- 9. Put the foam ball in the center of your fabric circle and slowly draw the strings up tightly. When the fabric is drawn snugly around the ball, make a tight bow.
- 10. To make sure your ties don't unravel, put a knot in each end.

You have just completed your very own pin cushion. Great job!

Food

Animals are like you. They like good clean food and they like to be fed on time. Give your pet a balanced diet. Make sure it provides adequate nourishment for a healthy pet.

Keep fresh water available at all times. Do not use the same pan for water that you use for food.

Answer these questions everyday:

1.	Do you always remember to feed your pet?
2.	Do you feed your pet at the same time each day?
3.	Does your pet always have a clean food dish?
4.	Do you always have clean, fresh water for your pet?

If you answered NO to any of these questions, then you need to work on making sure you can answer yes to them in the future.

DOG BISCUIT RECIPE

Here is a recipe for homemade dog biscuits that are healthy for your dog.

Dog Biscuits

5 cups whole wheat flour

1 teaspoon garlic or onion powder

1 cup milk

1 teaspoon salt ½ cup water

2 eggs 10 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 tablespoon bacon grease

Mix the above ingredients and stir until well blended. Pinch off the dough (about the size of a walnut) and roll them into small balls or make bone shapes. Put them on a greased cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 40 minutes. Let them cool and then store in an airtight container. Only give 2-3 biscuits to your dog per day!!!


