Livestock Arrival

- Sunday, July 13 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm: All animals may arrive on the grounds.

Livestock Official Check-in

- Sunday, July 13 from 4:00 to 9:00 pm: Official Check-in for ALL animals.
- **All animals MUST be in the barns by 9:00 pm.**

Bedding

- 2025 bedding fees:
 - poultry (1-9 birds)-\$5;
 - poultry (over 9 birds)-\$10.
- Beef & Dairy: provided
- Sheep & goats: provide your own.
- Swine: provide your own. WOOD SHAVINGS ONLY.

Bedding fees are to be paid at the Extension Office when you turn in your green livestock record books.

Registered Animals

If showing registered animal "Goat, Swine, or Beef", the superintendents MUST check papers.

Swine Information

Correct ear notches on ALL hogs MUST match swine enrollment form. If they do not match hogs cannot be unloaded & will not be allowed to show.

Questionable ear notches will be subject to review by screening committee; animal may be disqualified if the committee feels ear notches are fresh.

Remove old ear tags before weigh-in.

Please note **weight requirements:**

- Barrows: 200-300 lbs.
- Crossbred gilts: at least 200 lbs., no upper limit
- Purebred gilts with papers: no less than 180 lbs., no upper limit.

FANS IN BARNs

Only fans approved by superintendents will be allowed in ALL barns. Please make sure your fan is pointed in the same direction as everyone else in the barn. This will help with air circulation.

Rabbits are not allowed to have personal fans in the Rabbit Barn.

Rule for Swine Barn:

- Limit 1 approved fan per pen
- NO Turbo fans
- All fans must pull less then 2 amps!!!
- Blowing the same direction

Knox County Livestock Grooming Rule

The Knox County 4-H Council has adopted a new Livestock Grooming Assistance policies:

“All species: Grooming must be done within 100 feet of respective barn or in case of horses, from horse show arena. 4-H animal exhibitors shall be responsible for the continuous care, grooming, and preparation of their own animals entered into the Indiana State Fair. An exhibitor may receive assistance in the care, grooming, and preparation of the livestock entered in the Indiana State Fair, provided that the assistance shall be limited to explanation or demonstration and that the exhibitor is involved in the preparation.”

Clarification: This rule means that exhibitors are expected to take an active, hands-on role in the care, grooming, and fitting of their animals for show. While guidance, demonstration, and hands-on assistance by family and non-family members are allowed, the exhibitor must be physically involved in the preparation process. We recognize that there are certain instances where an exhibitor is showing in multiple barns while an animal is being prepared, and that is ok. We just don't want an exhibitor riding rides in the midway while someone else prepares their animal. This expectation reinforces our commitment to youth development and skill-building through participation.

Beef -

Moving cattle from barn to tie-outs MUST take place between 9:00 and 9:30 p.m. Cattle must be back in the barn by 10:00 a.m.

Beef Superintendents will designate the grooming area for beef cattle for the Knox County Fair.

Rabbits

On Monday, July 14 the Rabbit show will start at 9:00 a.m. in the Livestock Show Arena. Showmanship will show first. Please take all rabbit carriers home after the rabbit show.

Mentor Showmanship Class

Again, this year we will have a mentor showmanship class for Mini 4-H & 4-H members who do not own that species of animal. This is for 4-H members ONLY. Mentor showman will use another 4-H member's animal to show. Mini 4-H members showing animals over 300 lbs. must have the animals owner in control at all times. Goats, Swine, Sheep, Beef, Dairy, Llama & Alpaca.

MAKE-UP RING

Please make every effort to keep the make-up ring cluster free. Only the next class of animals should be in the make-up ring. This is not the place for you to tie up your animals for the entire show.

Behavior Code

All EXHIBITORS, PARENTS, and SPECTATORS will conduct themselves as ladies and gentlemen. They are to conduct themselves in such a way as to set a good example for other 4-H exhibitors and spectators at the show. IMPOLITE BEHAVIOR, POOR SPORTSMANSHIP, OR DISRUPTIVE ACTIONS (as deemed by the show management) will result in disqualification and/or removal from the fairgrounds.

Dress Code

Appropriate dress must be worn by all livestock 4-H exhibitors during shows, auction, and pictures. This includes NO halter-tops, bare midriffs, shorts, or t-shirts with inappropriate language. If not dressed appropriately a t-shirt will be provided to you. This will be the superintendent's decision.

Auction Information

A 5% administration fee will be deducted from each 4-H member going through the auction.

Pens not cleaned after the auction will result in auction money being withheld.

Any animal going through the Knox County auction will not be allowed to show at the Indiana State Fair.

You have to identify which animal you are taking through the auction by noon on Thursday, July 17!

Auction Pictures

We would like for each 4-H member who will be going through the 4-H Auction on Friday, July 19th to provide a **4 x 4 inch picture** of themselves with the species of livestock they will be selling in the auction. Please note it does not need to be the specific animal you will be auctioning that evening, just one of the same species. The name of the 4-H member needs to be printed on the back of the picture. **We must have the picture by Thursday, July 17th.**

This applies to Beef, Dairy, Goats, Llama/ Alpaca, Sheep, and Swine. Those who show Poultry, Rabbits and Horses need not worry about providing a picture.

QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE CERTIFICATES

Youth exhibiting Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep & Swine are required to complete training.

If you have completed a YQCA training online, please send a copy of your certificate to the Extension Office ASAP. If it is not completed by either training you will not be able to show!

Updated Livestock Release for 2025:

The Knox County Fair is looking for Livestock Family to **VOLUNTEER** to keep their livestock on the grounds through Saturday, July 19 by 9:00 pm.

The goal is to have 50% of the barn full for Saturday evening's crowd.

Many members of the public are only able to attend the Fair on the weekend. If the barns are empty by Saturday, the Fair loses a valuable opportunity to showcase all the hard work 4-H'ers' and 4-H animals have put in over the year. Your presence on Saturday helps maintain the full fair experience for those who may not be able to attend earlier in the week.

The official release of livestock is on Friday, July 18 after the auction at 12:01 AM.

- Trucks & trailers must stay in the parking lot until after 12:01 AM.
- Trucks & trailers are not allowed to be pulled up waiting beside the barns.
- After 12:01 AM, then trucks & trailers can be moved beside the barns to load animals.

Fair Passes

Each 4-H member will get a fair pass if they turn in their general record sheet! These are to be picked-up at the fair after you have turned in your projects for judging. Mini 4-H members get into the fair free due to their age and do not need a fair pass.

The Velcro on the back of your poster board needs 24 hours to properly “cure”. Please keep this in mind as you prepare your projects for the fair!

These supplies are available at the Knox County Extension Office. They must be picked up by **Wednesday, July 3 by 4:00 p.m.**

Poster Board & Velcro =	\$4.00
Poster & Salon Print Sleeves =	\$1.00
Electric 1 kits =	\$15.00

Tips for a Successful Project

- Read your project manual carefully for detailed instructions on exhibit preparation.
- If differences exists between the manual and the handbook, always follow the handbook.
- Remember, exhibits not completed according to the project rules will be judged on their own merit and will be dropped one ribbon placing.
- Remember, the poster is to be horizontal with the 28 inch side on the top. Posters not displayed horizontally will be dropped one ribbon placing as well.
- All posters must be no heavier than a foam board and covered with plastic prior to judging.
- No changes will be made after the judge has left.

Are your exhibits completed and meet all requirements? Not Sure?
Use this sheet as a final check before bringing your projects to the fair!

Exhibit Checklist

Remember that failure to meet all requirements for a project could result in a docked one ribbon color (at the judges' discretion). It is your responsibility to make sure your project meets all requirements. If you have questions don't wait until the last minute to ask for help.

1. Is the project itself complete?
2. Have you filled out your record sheet?
3. Have you checked your poster against the poster checklist?
4. Is your cake decorating skills card filled out and attached?
5. Is your sewing skills card filled out and attached?
6. Is your exhibit tag attached to the lower right hand side of project?
7. If foods, do you have a recipe card?
8. Is your craft project ready to use & has "Craft Information Card" (4-H 618A) attached?
9. Does your project require you to bring your manual?

Poster Checklist

Each poster should have the following to be judged. If the poster is missing one of the following it should be docked one ribbon color (at the judges' discretion) and can not be considered for a Champion.

1. Is it 22" by 28"?
2. Is it horizontal?
3. Does it have a firm backing? Foam core board does not need additional backing. Plywood backing is not allowed*
4. Is it covered with clear plastic sleeve (not saran-wrap)?
5. Is your exhibit tag in the lower right hand corner?
6. Do other labels meet requirements if applicable?

Vehicle & Golf Cart/Side-by-Side Policy

Please see the Fair Board publications for the **COST and POLICY Updates** for vehicles and golf carts/ side-by-sides!

- **Passenger number should not exceed seating capacity.**
- **All drivers must have a current drivers licensed!**
- After 4:00 p.m. **NO** vehicles should be driven on the grounds except for fair officials and handicap use.
- The fair board is not responsible for injuries or damaged vehicles.
- Any vehicle caught abusing these guidelines is subject to removal from grounds.



Parking/Driving Rules will be enforced during the Knox County Fair!

Please read below for more details:

During the 2024 Knox County Fair all vehicles who will use the road around the fairgrounds will enter the fairgrounds on the west-side (Vincennes side). The east-side (Bicknell side) will be closed after 4:00 pm each day of the fair. There will be one-way traffic around the loop of the fairgrounds going west toward Vincennes, making it safer for fairgoers.

For those 4-H Families who need to drive up to the barns to feed/water their animals after 4:00 p.m., you must use the west-side entrance and drive down the first isle to use the specified gate. This gate will be located in between the rabbit and poultry barns. **YOU MUST HAVE A CAR PASS IN ORDER TO GET INTO THE FAIRGROUNDS WITH A VEHICLE.** This pass will allow the driver plus one person into the grounds. Any other people in the vehicle must show their 4-H pass or pay to get in. **THIS WILL BE ENFORCED!**

Car passes may be purchased at the Fair Office.

Parking is prohibited along the rabbit and poultry barn or across the road from the rabbit and poultry barn along the fence. Violators will be towed.

Overnight Stays @ The Fair

Purdue University set a policy for no overnight stays at the fairgrounds during the 4-H fairs. The Knox County 4-H Council has adopted this policy. Effective January 1st, 1998 there will be no 4-H liability or health insurance coverage provided to youth during overnight stays at the fair. The Knox County Fair Board has adopted a policy that all youth must be accompanied by a parent or guardian or an adult signing they are responsible for the youth's activities, in order to spend the night at the fair. Forms are available at the Fair Office for overnight stays.
