Martin County 4-H Fair

The fair is a showcase celebration that provides the opportunity for the community to enjoy the talents of our local youth through projects, demonstrations, and exhibitions, including but not limited to: livestock care and showmanship, art and craft skills, cooking, baking, welding and craftsmanship. Project submissions were both virtual and live. More than 600 projects were submitted by the youth of Martin County!

Performing Arts

Bottle Caps to Benches

This project, lead by the Martin County Jr Leaders, saved plastic from entering landfills. With 810 lbs. of plastic bottles caps being recycled, 6 benches were created for the community.

Clover Gaming

Cover Gaming is new STEM program that fosters critical thinking, creativity, competition, and collaboration through the design of board games. Programming was delivered through community and school programs to youth in Martin County. Youth learned presentation skills, career options, new project processes and logistics.

WHAT IT MEANS TO MARTIN COUNTY

FOOD INSECURITY

12.9% of Martin County residents are food insecure. Food insecurity refers to USDA's measure of lack of access, at times, to enough food for an active, healthy life for all household members and limited or uncertain availability of nutritionally adequate foods. Food-insecure households are not necessarily food insecure all the time. Food insecurity may reflect a household's need to make trade-offs between important basic needs, such as housing or medical bills, and purchasing nutritionally adequate foods.

FOOD BOX DISTRIBUTION

Over 8,700 Farmers to Families food boxes were distributed between September 2020 and April 2021. This is approximately \$426,300 worth of food. The food boxes contained dairy, protein, and fresh produce.

Farmers to Families Food Box Program

Canners were tested for \$5 at the conclusion of the program of which 1 canner failed and saved food waste, and maybe even stopped a food illness.
