Why join 4-H Junior Leaders?

Serving as a 4-H Junior Leader is an honor, an opportunity, a privilege, and a responsibility. By being a 4-H Jr. Leader, you can:

- Encourage the development of young adults.
- Provide assistance to the local 4-H Clubs and their 4-H Adult Leaders.
- Assist in the leadership of 4-H members, activities and programs.
- Develop your ability to work with others.
- Have FUN and make new friends.
- Become eligible for 4-H trips, awards, and scholarships.
- Develop your abilities to plan, organize and reason.
- Be a leader in your community.
- Volunteer to help better the 4-H program and community.
- Collaborate, socialize and experience 4-H on another level.

Who

You are able to join if:

- You are currently in grade 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12.
- You are currently enrolled in 4-H.
- You must be enrolled in at least one other 4-H project and Junior Leaders.

When do 4-H Junior Leaders meet?

Meetings are held at least once a month. Additional 4-H Jr. Leader activities occur throughout the year to allow 4-H Jr. Leaders to be actively involved in their community.
