

Livestock Information

Indiana Livestock Quality Training

We held our first training in February and had 24 youth in attendance! Thank you very much for all that have completed this training. Be sure to make it to the next two trainings if possible. We will have two more trainings this spring in Posey County that will be paid for by the 4-H Council. Both trainings will be held at the Posey County Community and Events Center (PCCEC). If you can't attend these events, you will need to go to a class in a different county or can take the training online. This will not be provided by the 4-H Council though.

Livestock Superintendents- After the May 13th training at 6 p.m., there will be a training for you on Fair Entry by 4-H Educator, Lauren from Dubois County. She will be there for however long to help answer all of your questions! She will not be available the week of our fair and it's very important for you to attend this training! There won't be the assistance the week of the fair like you've had in the past.

Animal ID -Tagging

All beef, dairy, meat goat, sheep and swine exhibitors are required to correctly enter animal tag ID's into 4-H Online. <u>You will not be allowed to enter 0's into the tag entry on 4-H Online.</u>

This year you will fill out a Google Document. Then we will email you back once the tags are ready to pick up. At this time, there will be no tagging day. Not sure what you need? This document is very detailed in helping you select your answers.

Registering your premises is done online, at no charge, and takes only about 5 minutes. Visit the Indiana State Board of Animal Health's (BOAH) website: www.in.gov/boah and click on "Premises Registration".

BOAH staff will issue a premise identification number (also known as a "premID") within three to five business days after the online form is submitted. If registering by mail with a paper form, allow ten business days for a premID to be issued.

Do you need to verify your premises identification number? Contact BOAH at: 317-544-2400 or email animalhealth@boah.in.gov. Be sure to note the name and premises' physical address listed on the registration.

All Indiana premises associated with the purchase, sale and/or exhibition of cattle, swine, sheep, goats and farmed cervids must be registered by state law. Registration allows BOAH to be more effective tracing animal movements in a major animal health emergency investigation.

4-H Online Animal ID Family Sharing

Please note that you are only allowed to list siblings' animals on your 4-H Online profile. You cannot list secondary family animals on your 4-H Online. This means you cannot list cousins' animals on your profile. If you have any questions, please contact the Extension Office 812-838-1331.

Official ID

An Official ID tag is imprinted with an "US shield"

Official ID tags include but not limited to Scrapie Tag, Flock ID, visual 840 Tags &/or 840 RFID Tags.

Official ID tags are permanent & tamper resistant.

It is a FELONY to remove an Official Identification!

If you have questions on which tags to remove, please contact the Extension Office at 812-838-1331.

Animal ID Deadline

All animal identification is to be submitted on 4-H Online by May 15. Animals not enrolled by this deadline cannot be exhibited at the county or state fair.

2024 Indiana 4-H Animal Identification

The following table lists the different animal species and the respective form of identification that is required for a 4-H member to be eligible to show in the 4-H livestock shows at the 2024 Indiana State Fair. The animal ID information must be entered in the Indiana 4-H Online enrollment system by the respective deadlines. Missing, incomplete or incorrect animal ID information could result in state fair ineligibility for that particular animal.

- Donors may choose to remain anonymous.




