4-H Camp, June 8-10, 2022

4-H Camp at Epworth Forest in North Webster, Indiana will begin Wednesday, June 8 (9AM) and will end Friday, June 10 (2PM).

Any Steuben County 4-H member in grades 3-6 (21-22 school year) is welcome and the cost is \$180.00. (before the Steuben County 4-H Fair Board sponsorship, **keep reading!**)

The cost includes 7 meals, snacks, cabin lodging, temporary insurance, activities and instruction. The camp store may have snacks and other items available to purchase.

Special Note: The Steuben County 4-H Fair Board will pay 50% of your registration fee which is \$90.00, leaving the remaining 50% balance of \$90.00 due at time of registration.

Final camp registration will be done when campers first arrive. Campers are asked to arrive at Epworth Forest 9AM to 10AM on Wednesday, June 8.

Closing ceremonies will be at 2PM on Friday, June 10 with check-out at 3PM.

To assure that you have the most fun at 4-H Camp this year, please return your forms to the County Extension Office as soon as possible. Camp registrations are taken on a first-come, first-serve basis, so don't wait or you might be too late!

Health Forms and Medical Information

A Registered Nurse will be on site during the entire stay at camp. The Nurse will be the sole person to administer your child's required medications, and said medications will be stored in a locked cabinet at all times.

Please complete the Health Form enclosed and turn in with your Camp Registration by May 1st.

Any medication the child may need should be



brought in the container in which they are issued (with medical orders and physician's name intact.)

Please place all medications in a zip-lock bag with camper's name.

Medications must be turned into the camp nurse during registration, so it is best not to pack them inside a suitcase.

Camp Rules

Non-aerosol Insect Repellent

Any youth breaking 4-H Camp behavior rules or determined to be a risk by the Extension Educator will be dismissed at the families expense.

There will be no reimbursements given for cancellations after June 1st or dismissals.

- 1. Any rules broken by camper(s) or counselor(s), if deemed severe enough, will result in 4-H'ers parents being called and the youth involved being sent home.
- 2. Camper must report illness/injury to nurse immediately.
- Close-toed shoes must be worn at all times except when traveling to and from the beachfront or showers. (Sandals or flip flops may be worn at those times.)
- 4. All items should be marked so that the camper will recognize his or her own belongings. This is especially important on swimsuits, cameras and other valuables.
- 5. Any medication taken regularly by a camper must be given to the camp nurse, who will dispense it to the camper at the designated time. Campers must contact the nurse at appropriate times when prescribed medication is to be taken.

- 6. No camper is allowed in the lake or in canoes except when a lifeguard is present.
- 7. No visitors are permitted during the camping period unless cleared with the Camp Director.
- 8. Campers are required to be present at all sessions. Full time participation is required! No youth will be allowed to leave and return for any reason.
- 9. Cell phones will not be permitted, please leave at home.
- 10. Epworth Forest or Purdue Extension Staff cannot be

responsible for articles or money left, lost or stolen at 4-H Camp.

Do not bring large amounts of money, expensive cameras and/or other valuable articles.

Behavioral Criteria for 4-H Events and Activities:

(Recommend distributing with health forms for trips/activities.)

To 4-H members, volunteers, parents and the public: When attending, participating or acting on behalf of the 4-H program, all persons are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with accepted standards of social behavior, to respect rights of others, and to refrain from any conduct which may be injurious to the 4-H program. The following actions constitute misconduct for which persons may be subject to disciplinary consequences and/or dismissal from the program:

- (a) Dishonesty in connection with any 4-H activity by cheating or knowingly furnishing false information.
- (b) Alteration or unauthorized use of 4-H records.
- (c) Obstruction or disruption of any 4-H activity or aiding and encouraging other persons to engage in such conduct.
- (d) Failure to comply or aiding or encouraging other persons not to comply with specific terms and conditions of a given project, contest, or activity.
- (e) Failure to comply with directions of 4-H officials acting in the proper performance of their duties.
- (f) Inhumane treatment of 4-H animal projects.

There are many opportunities for 4-H members, volunteers, parents and the public to participate in 4-H events and activities. When involved in such experiences, members, volunteers, parents and the public are expected to follow all rules and regulations as outlined by those responsible for the specific program or activity. In all such 4-H activities, the following constitute a violation of behavioral expectations:

- 1. Possession or use of fire crackers, gun powder, firearms, chemicals or other materials that can be used to create an explosive mixture.
- 2. Misuse of fire equipment or sounding a false fire alarm.
- 3. Having a guest of a different gender in your sleeping quarters, or inappropriate sexual behavior.
- 4. Physical or verbal abuse of any person or conduct which threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person.
- 5. Theft of or malicious damage to property.
- 6. Possession, use, or distribution of alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco and tobacco-like products, electronic smoking devices (including, but not limited to, e-cigs, vapes, juuls), or other dangerous substances.
- 7. Inappropriate displays of affection towards another person(s).
- 8. Distribution, misuse, or abuse of over-the-counter, homeopathic (including supplements and vitamins), or prescription medications.
- 9. Inappropriate clothing or lack of clothing during the event or activity.
- 10. Lewd, indecent, or obscene conduct or language.
- 11. Unauthorized entry, use or occupancy of any facility.
- 12. Any conduct which threatens or interferes with maintenance of appropriate order and discipline or invades the rights of others.
- 13. Unwillingness to follow appropriate health and safety procedures.
- 14. Reckless or inappropriate behavior.

When violations occur at out-of-county, district, area, state and/or national 4-H events, the following procedures will be followed.

- (a) The parents/legal guardians may be contacted to arrange transportation home for the violator(s) and
- (b) The local extension educator may be notified.
