SOIL TESTING AVAILABLE

Soil testing is recommended every 3 – 5 years. The Purdue Extension Vermillion County Office will take your garden soil samples (they must be dry) for nutrient & pH analysis and send them to a soils lab for fertilizer recommendations for \$12. For \$5 more an organic matter analysis will be completed. Soil sample bags, sample forms, and instructions can be picked up at the Office. For details, call 765-492-5330 or email cox119@purdue.edu.

HERBICIDE 101 WORKSHOP – April 29



Everyone interested in learning how best to control invasive species is invited to the Herbicide 101 Workshop being hosted by the Vermillion County Soil & Water Conservation District, Purdue Extension, and the Wabash River Invasives Project. ORDER STATE TREE SEEDLINGS FOR SPRING PLANTING



Landowners in Indiana are fortunate to have access to inexpensive, high-quality tree and shrub seedlings from the Indiana DNR Division of Forestry nurseries. These seedlings are 1, 2 and 3 year-old bare-root plants intended for conservation plantings: windbreaks, wildlife habitat, reforestation, erosion control and other conservation uses in Indiana. The seedlings are not to be planted for landscaping or Christmas trees or resold as rooted stock. Seedlings are available in multiples of 50 or 100; or in packets containing a mixture

of species for different planting purposes like native nuts, fine hardwoods, upland or bottomland or wildlife plantings. Access instructions for ordering and the order form with available tree species is at <http://www.in.gov/dnr/forestry/3620.htm>. If you wish to order and pay for seedlings via the internet follow this link: <http://www.inforestryx.com>. Click on the Tree Seedling tab and proceed to making your purchase. If you are tax exempt, you will still have to order by mail or fax. Ordering for the 2024 – 2025 season started last October. As of this writing, there were still 208,300 seedlings left that comprised 25 hardwood and softwood species. For more information call the Vallonia State Nursery at 812-358-3621.

FREE WELL WATER TESTING



The Vermillion County Soil & Water Conservation District is once again offering a free well water test to all residents of Vermillion County, Indiana. The test will include bacteria, nitrates, lead, arsenic, and copper. Free water testing kits and instructions will be available from June 2 thru June 17. Sample kits can be obtained Monday – Friday at the Vermillion County SWCD office (in the Vermillion Co. Courthouse Annex) 9:00 am to 3:00 pm or the Vermillion County Public Library in Newport, 10 am to 5 pm. Contact 765-492-3705 for

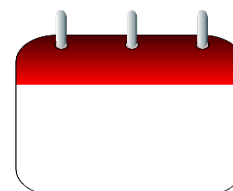

DINING WITH DIABETES will be held Thursdays, May 8, 15, 22, and 29, from 10:00 AM to Noon at the Vermillion County Health Department. Purdue Extension Vermillion County is once again partnering with the Vermillion County Health Department to offer this program for adults with type 2 diabetes, or who are at risk of type 2 diabetes, and their family members, caregivers, and support persons. The program will help you learn the skills needed to promote good health. Dining with Diabetes consists of four sessions and a follow-up, and is taught by trained and caring educators.

The program includes:

- planning meals and snacks with delicious and healthy recipes
- cooking demonstrations and food sampling
- motivation and support — connect with others who are living with diabetes
- ideas for being more active
- an understanding of how diabetes affects your overall health



Advance registration is required. Vermillion County residents who have not attended a previous Dining With Diabetes class may attend at no cost, thanks to the generosity of the Cardiovascular and Diabetes Coalition of Indiana. For those who have attended a previous class, or live outside of Vermillion County, the registration fee is \$40 per person, or \$65 for a couple. Let Purdue Extension help you “Get WalkIN” — Begins May 1st! Spring is here and that means nicer weather with more time spent outdoors. Why not take this opportunity to start walking and moving more? Walking is a popular form of physical activity—and good for your health! Of American adults, only half get the recommended amount of physical activity. Lack of physical activity is directly related to the occurrence of adult obesity. Regular physical activity can lower risk of heart disease, high blood pressure, type 2 diabetes, osteoporosis, depression, and falls in older adults. Walking is an excellent way for most people to increase their physical activity. It is an easy way to start and maintain a physically active lifestyle. Walking is accessible to almost anyone, doesn’t require specific skills or fancy workout clothes and equipment.

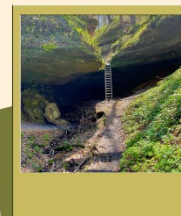

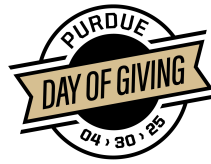
