Purdue Extension Vermillion County is partnering with the Vermillion County Health Department to offer **Dining With Diabetes** for adults with type 2 diabetes, or who are at risk of type 2 diabetes, and their family members, caregivers, and support persons. The program will help you learn the skills needed to promote good health. Dining with Diabetes consists of four sessions and a follow-up and is taught by trained educators.

The program includes:

- planning meals and snacks with delicious and healthy recipes
- · cooking demonstrations and food sampling
- motivation and support connect with others who are living with diabetes
- ideas for being more active
- an understanding of how diabetes affects your overall health

Vermillion County residents who have not attended a previous Dining With Diabetes class may attend at no cost. For those who have attended a previous class, the registration fee is \$40 per person, or \$65 for a couple. Registration will be online, with a link provided to those who are interested. A MATTER OF BALANCE will be offered again this fall in Vermillion County. The cost is \$25/person for the 8-session series. Participants must attend at least 5 of the 8 sessions to be considered complete. Minimum class size is 8 participants, maximum is 12.

Tallgrass Prairie Hike at Jackson-Schnyder Nature Preserve – July 12

Everyone is invited to a tallgrass prairie hike at Ouabache Land Conservancy's (OLC) Jackson-Schnyder Nature Preserve, west of St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, on Saturday, July 12th from 10:00 to 11:30 am. Phil Cox, Purdue University Extension Educator, and Dr. Jim Nardi, University of Illinois Research Entomologist (retired), will lead hikers on the Julius Trail around the 4-acre tallgrass prairie identifying the native and invasive flora, pollinators, and other insects of the prairie, while discussing recommended native plants along the way. The preserve is located at 3635 W. Concannon Ave., West Terre Haute, IN 47885. Prairie dropseed and white false indigo plants will be available while supplies last. No reservations are required and participants are encouraged to wear long pants and sturdy shoes for this easy, free family-friendly hike.

Pollinator Celebration at the Clinton Public Library – July 21

Join Purdue Extension as we celebrate pollinators at the Clinton Public Library on July 21, 6:00 – 7:30 pm. Learn about pollinator conservation and receive free pollinator plants to take home with you. 2025 Indiana Pesticide Clean Sweep Project - Pesticide Disposal forms due August 8

The Indiana Pesticide Clean Sweep Pesticide Disposal Program is designed to collect and dispose of suspended, canceled, banned, unusable, opened, unopened or just unwanted pesticides (herbicides, insecticides, rodenticides, fungicides, miticides, etc.). This disposal service is free of charge up to 250 pounds per participant. Over 250 pounds there will be a \$3.00 per pound charge. This is a great opportunity for you to legally dispose of unwanted products at little or no cost. All public and private schools, golf courses, nurseries, farmers, ag dealers, public, cities, towns, municipalities and county units of government or others receiving this notice are eligible to participate. Each event is 9:00 am to 2:00 pm local time. Locations closest to Vermillion County are:
