PROJECT COMPLETION DEADLINE IS AUGUST 31, 2022

If you didn't exhibit your project at the 2022 Fair, you can still complete your project by following the 4-H Handbook guidelines listed below.

The completion of a 4-H project must not be misinterpreted as exhibition of said project at a local, county or state fair. A 4-H member is considered to have completed their project for that year when they have:

- 1. Completed an "official" 4-H Member Enrollment Form prior to the established and published date for enrolling.
- 2. Turned in a completed 4-H project record sheet prior to the established and published date; and
- 3. Had an officially recognized 4-H Leader/Extension Educator verify the existence of the completed project or activity.

Exhibiting in the county and/or state fair is not required for project completion, as it does not necessarily relate directly to content and skills learned in the development of the 4-H project. Project exhibition is encouraged as a continuation of the educational experiences.

You must complete one project to complete the 4-H Year.

NOTE: If you show your completed project to your leader, the leader must notify the Extension Office so that completion can be recorded.

WHITE ACHIEVEMENT CARD DEADLINE IS SEPTEMBER 15, 2022

You are able to update your White Achievement Cards at the Extension Office until September 15th at 4:00 p.m. This card is used for 4-H Trip Applications, Achievement Awards and Scholarships.

Go grocery shopping together, cook meals and prepare snacks together, keep things positive around food choices, and set a good example with food variety and physical activity.



Overnight Oatmeal

Ingredients

- 1 cup uncooked old fashioned rolled oats
- · 1 cup low-fat yogurt
- 1/2 cup nonfat or 1% milk
- · 1/2 cup berries, fresh or frozen
- 1/2 cup chopped apple (about 1/3 a medium apple)

Directions

- 1. In a medium bowl, mix oats, yogurt and
- 2. Add the fruit now or add just before eating.
- 3. Cover and refrigerate oatmeal mixture for 6-12 hours. For grab-and-go breakfasts, place scoops of mixture in small dishes or spoon into small containers with lids. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.



Adults need vaccines, too. Vaccinations save lives.

The number of lives lost to preventable diseases is staggering. A quarter of all deaths (and some believe even up to half) could be prevented with early preventative actions, according to the National Library of Health. Imagine if you could prevent serious illness for you and your family. You can begin today with one small step: vaccination.

Vaccines work by training your immune system to recognize and fight the virus or bacteria when it comes in contact with your body. They help you fight disease without getting extremely sick. Vaccines teach our bodies to recognize dangerous pathogens.

There are 12 vaccines most recommended for adults.

Talk to a health care provider about which of these are right for you!
