

Grade (as of January of current year)

Collections may be large or small, very expensive and valuable or inexpensive. As you start collecting as a 4-H project, we want you to have fun—to enjoy your hobby—and 4-H will give you incentive for developing a collection and a chance to share your hobby with others as you display your collection—or part of it at the Jasper County Fair.

The choice is yours. You may choose any type of article you desire. Here are suggestions, but the choices are unlimited:

Buttons	Matchbooks	Arrowheads
Leaves	Glass	Cups & Saucers
Flowers	Rocks	Antiques
Salt Shakers	Stamps	Dishes
Models .	Coins	Bottles
Pitchers	Spoons	Dolls
Baseball Cards	Football Cards	Pencils
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After selecting the type of articles you are going to collect, keep a record on how your collection grows by filling out the attached sheets. Remember to put your actual RECORD SHEET in your Green Record Folder, Your RECORD OF PURCHASES and your STORY should be checked in with your project at pre-fair check-in.

Because of space and display restrictions, no living plants or animals may be displayed as a collection. Your Story and your Record of Purchases will be considered and judged as an important part of your collection exhibit. Your Record Sheet MUST be turned in with your Green Record folder in order for you to exhibit your project at the County Fair. Remember, this is YOUR collection and YOUR project.

#### Project Rules:

- 1. ALL completed record sheets and manuals/activity books must be turned in to the 4-H club leader by July 1st, and must be securely attached in the green "Indiana 4-H Club Member's Record Book".
- 2. It should go without saying that the collection must be owned by the 4-H'er, and may not be "borrowed" from someone else.
- 3. In all divisions if the collection is too large or valuable to exhibit, a notebook containing photos and descriptions of your collection can be exhibited with, or in place of, your collection.
- 4. Collection may be taken home after judging IF a collection of photos in album form (3 ring binder, etc.) is left in its place. Collections must be signed out by 4-H'er at the office. Photo quality will not be judged, but they should be clear, sharp photos if possible. NOTE: All photos should be neatly arranged, labeled and mounted in a notebook with the completed "My Record of Purchases" page included.
- 5. No living plants or animals may be displayed.
- 6. "Record of Purchases" and "My Story" pages must be exhibited with collection.

#### Beginner (Grades 3-5)

Exhibit a portion or example of the collection, not to exceed 2'x3'x3' high.

#### Intermediate (Grades 6-8)

Exhibit a new collection, or a continuation of the previous division. Exhibit must not exceed 2'x3'x3' high.

#### Advanced (Grades 9-12)

Exhibit a new collection, or a continuation of the previous division. Exhibit must not exceed 3'x3'x4' high.

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# Exhibit Suggestions

The Extension Office, 4-H Council, and the Fairboard cannot take responsibility for any damage, loss, or theft of a collector's exhibit. Protection and precaution will be used to safeguard the exhibits in as much as is reasonably possible. It is therefore recommended that valuable objects be protected in a display board or left at home.

# Judging Guidelines:

- 1. Judging will be based on neatness and completeness of records.
- 2. The Judge will review your story, taking your age/grade into account.
- 3. Are your items ready for exhibit? Are they clean, labeled, and displayed in a an appropriate manner?
- 4. The judge will look for originality, arrangement of display and/or notebook.
- 5. While judging collections that have been in more than 1 year, the judge will consider your growth as a collector. That is—have you added to your collection within the past year and what have you done to increase your knowledge about this hobby?
